
*Opening Sentences

Amos 5:18, 20; 1 Thessalonians 4:13, 16; Matthew 25:6, 10

- Woe to you who desire the day of the LORD! Why would you have the day of the LORD?
- Is not the day of the LORD darkness, and not light, and gloom with no brightness in it?
- P But we do not want you to be uninformed, brothers, about those who are asleep, that you may not grieve as others do who have no hope.

- We come to think the day will never come when You make all things new, and have let our earthly circumstances cause faith to waiver, despair to increase, and doubts to arise. Forgive us.




I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth.


