
BAPTISM CLASS



IN LOVING MEMORY OF
REV. DR. DAVID WIESNER

March 19, 1933 - August 7, 2024

Rev. Dr. David Emil Wiesner was born on Sunday, March 19, 1933, to Dan Wiesner and Viola née Broeg Wiesner of Waukon, Iowa. He was baptized at Trinity Lutheran Church, Athens, Wisconsin on Saturday, March 3, 1934, and confirmed his faith on Sunday, April 14, 1946, at Holy Cross Lutheran Church, St. Louis, Missouri. David enlisted in the United States Marine Corp on March 1, 1952. During the time that he was a new recruit, he met the love of his life, Joyce Marie Joggerst. David and Joyce were married on October 17, 1953, at Holy Cross Lutheran Church, St. Louis, Missouri and celebrated their 70th wedding anniversary last October!

After his honorable discharge from the Marines, he obtained a Bachelor's degree from Concordia College, River Forest, Illinois. He became a teacher at Lutheran Central High School in St. Louis, Missouri, teaching American History, Physical Education, and was a coach. He later received a PhD from St. Louis University in the area of Education & Administration. David served as Principal of Affton Senior High School; and then later, Superintendent of the Lutheran High Schools.

Throughout his adult life, David maintained a strong faith in God along with a deep desire to serve as a parish pastor. In his early 50's, David realized his dream when he attended Concordia Seminary, St. Louis. He was ordained on Sunday, March 3, 1985, and served as a Pastor at Peace Lutheran Church, Saint Louis, Missouri, his home congregation, from 1985-1992, as Associate Pastor, and from 1992-1994 as Senior Pastor. David retired from full-time ministry at 62, and served as a part-time Visitation Pastor at St. John's Lutheran Church of Arnold, Missouri. He called on shut-in members, a work that he thoroughly enjoyed.

On Wednesday, August 7, 2024, our gracious Lord called David out of this life to receive the crown of life that He had prepared for David. David is survived by his wife Joyce, daughter Debra Ettl, son Rev. Mark (Patricia) Wiesner, granddaughters Andrea Wiesner and SarahBeth (Rev. Gregory) Barto, great-grandsons Harrison and Crosby Barto, his brother and sister-in-law Terry (Di) Joggerst.

A public visitation was held on Tuesday, August 13 from 4:00-7:00PM at Kutis Funeral Home. A private memorial service was held for the family, with burial at Jefferson Barracks National Cemetery.

ST. TRINITY CEMETERY - OFFICE AUTOMATION

St. Trinity Cemetery has recently taken a step toward a more automated operation with the purchase and implementation of software called Cemetery Information Management System (CIMS), from vendor Ramaker and Associates. This cloud-based system allows the staff and board remote access to lot ownership and burial records from any location. It also provides reports on available lots, and cemetery statistics for lot sales, interments, etc. We are able to customize it for our specific layout of lots and columbarium niches, and add additional lots as future development is warranted. Report and form development for automated generation of deeds and sales contracts is also in process. Finally, the system can be used for task scheduling and daily operations management.

Looking to the future, we also hope to leverage CIMS' online mapping capabilities. A virtual map of the cemetery, created using existing cemetery maps and data in conjunction with drone imagery, would be made available online. This would allow anyone to search the records of St. Trinity Cemetery for information on burials, as well as visuals of the grave and surrounding property. CIMS is also used by Bellefontaine Cemetery, and they have implemented this mapping feature. Scan the QR code below, search for "Busch", select "Adolphus Busch", and scroll down to see an example.



Kudos to Board Member Wayne Schuessler, who has led this effort, worked with the vendor on the implementation, and continues to build out the data in the system. We are very excited about the possibilities!

LIFE MINISTRY - A SPECTACLE



The 2024 Summer Olympic Games treated the world to quite a spectacle. The opening ceremonies were an in-your-face mockery of Christianity including a drag queen parody of the Last Supper, a golden calf, a macabre image of a beheaded Queen Marie Antoinette holding her severed head and a lewd portrayal of the pagan god Dionysus. Dionysus, also known as Bacchus, was the god of wine and debauchery. He represents a society that enshrines self-indulgence, immorality, and perversion: the works of the flesh.

The values presented in the opening ceremonies are in total opposition to the qualities needed to win an Olympic event: focus, discipline, perseverance, and commitment to a goal. Those are the same qualities mentioned in Hebrews 12 where we are told to set aside every weight and sin to run our own race in leading a Christian life. Our focus is on Jesus and his sacrifice for us. Our discipline is from a God who is using the trials in our life to yield the fruit of righteousness.

France, host of the Olympics, is a nation that prides itself for its secular society. What are the fruits of such values? The Christian faith that made France a center for the arts and science has been shunted aside. French churches are nearly empty while the expanding Muslim population fills the spiritual vacuum with its own version of paganism. In fact, many churches have been torched and antisemitism is at record levels. The void created by abandoning Christianity was filled with a new paganism that is now openly embraced. The culture in which the French took pride has been lost. It has been replaced with one of coarseness, cruelty, and violence.

America is on the same path. Our public schools have been pushing the same secular values. Our entertainment is largely violent, crude, and immoral. Wealth and pleasure have become our modern idols. Our nation's history is being rewritten so that the great leaders of the past are denigrated, and their achievements and sacrifices dismissed as inconsequential. Christianity is portrayed as a bigoted system of outdated superstitions. When we lose reverence for our rich heritage which was grounded in Christianity, we lose the very soul of our nation.

Hebrews 12 speaks of a great cloud of witnesses, the saints who have gone before us and given us examples of great faith. This heavenly spectacle is the total opposite of the one seen in Paris this summer. As Christianity comes under increasing hostility, it has never been more important to discipline ourselves to prayer, memorizing scripture and regular fellowship with other Christians. Our goal is to join the heavenly spectacle of saints.

THE EXTRAORDINARY ORDINARY LIFE - THE ADVENTURE HAS A PARTY

When Christ entered your life, you were thrust into an adventure. You have been transformed from sinner to also saint—to a child of God, and reminded every person is an eternal being. We are beset with the foes of our own sinful natures, the broken world, and the devils. We are hard-pressed to make it on our own.

No adventurer makes it through on his own. Friends and family, even strangers, help along the way. This is true also for the Christian. We talk a lot about being individuals in America (pulling ourselves up by our own bootstraps, etc.). This has seeped into our faith as well. We speak of our individual or personal relationship with Jesus.

But there is no going solo for a Christian. God gives us a party of people for this adventure. Jesus had twelve close disciples and many more who travelled after Him. Apostles typically went out in pairs or groups to do their work. When people began to believe, they did not go their own way but would come together in the faith. Even the name “church” in the Greek means “gathering” or “assembly”. Why does God want us to stick together?

Last month, we noted that you are in grave danger from the devil and the rebellious world. One individual is much easier to overwhelm and destroy than two or even more. The devil and the world are happy to have Christians try to go it alone. It makes their job much easier. When we come together, we can help one another, forgive one another, hold each other accountable to Christ, and encourage one another to stay on the narrow path of Jesus to eternal life.

The American way has tried to teach us that faith is a personal, private matter. But that is not the way Jesus describes it. We cannot help each other if we cannot talk about the faith. If we cannot be truthful about both the Gospel and the Law, we cannot help one another.

In America, parents try not to impose their faith on their children and think they are being good parents if they let the children choose. *This is nonsense.* “Indoctrination” is a bad word among us. It brings to mind images of Hitler and Stalin. But the word itself means “the process wherein a person is brought up to understand a particular set of truths.” In this sense, indoctrinate your children in Jesus.

If the only place children hear about Jesus or the Christian faith is on Sunday mornings, they will choose what speaks to them during the other 99% of their waking hours each week—the world. Either we will indoctrinate our people into Christ, or the world will indoctrinate them into idolatry. There is no other option.

We do not get to make God. God gets to make us. The Church does not give its children a choice of competing stories because there is only one *true* story. The world does not have this true story because it does not know Jesus. And it is the job of the community to make each of its members a part of that story. God uses this community to make us His people and to keep us as His people. Through being held accountable to one another and by forgiving one another we, together, live out the adventure set before us, and our enemies clamor to no avail. Life is ours, together, all the way to the Victory!


