CHANGES TO OUR CAMPUS DOOR POLICY

As our county situation has shifted over the past few years regarding homeless persons, Peace has experienced a considerable uptick in persons off the street coming to the church to beg, loiter, sleep, steal, and even attempt to break into the garage and the campus. Men show up and loiter after services or toward the end of the workday. They show up and wander around outside the doors where parents are picking up their children from daycare to panhandle.

We have asked the County Police to scout our campus more often and they appear to have adopted that request. However, for the safety and security of the Church staff and the children of the Early Childhood Program, we have updated our policy regarding leaving our doors unlocked.

SOME HIGHLIGHTS

Unless other events are going on, the doors will be locked on Sundays until at least 5:30AM and locked again soon after the final service of the day.

Likewise, on Saturdays, the doors will be locked until at least 3:00PM and locked again soon after the service is completed. During the weekdays, the East doors should only be opened from 8:00AM-5:00PM unless other activities require them to be open.

If no one is on campus, the doors will be locked.

For events and clubs, the doors should be unlocked only as long as the situation reasonably warrants.

If our office personnel or other groups comprised of only females are present, they have the right to lock the exterior doors even during the weekday work hours.

If you do not have a key and find the doors locked, please use the intercom to see if a person is in the office to let you in. All persons that we know with an assigned key to the church will receive a copy of the full door policy in their church mailbox.

This change will take effect October 1, 2025.





St. Trinity Cemetery UPDATED FLOWER & DECORATION POLICY

The Board of St. Trinity Cemetery would like to make all aware that an updated Flower and Decoration Policy has recently been adopted. Highlights to note include:

- Decorations will be cleared only once per year, during the first two weeks of February, weather and schedule permitting. Items which are excessively worn or damaged may be cleared at any time.
- Only one flower wreath or bouquet per grave is permitted.
- Containers, potted plants, baskets, balloons and other such items are not allowed.
- Funeral flowers are removed 5-7 days after an interment.

Regarding decorations for the columbarium niches, the adhesion of items via Command hooks or any other means is no longer permitted. The adhesives have caused permanent damage to the stonework of the columbaria. Items are also not allowed to be placed on top of, or in the ground in front of, the columbaria. We understand the desire to honor loved ones enshrined in the columbarium niches with floral tributes, and are currently researching a way to affix a permanent floral vase to be installed on the face of a columbarium niche, without causing damage to the structure. This information will be communicated when it is available. Updated floral regulations are posted on the website, as well as in the message board at the cemetery.

LIFE MINISTRY- SYNTHETIC HUMANS?

"He looks just like his dad." "She takes after her mother." Comments like these are a recognition of how God uses the genetics of our parents to create us as unique individuals. But what happens when science manipulates human reproduction to include more than a mom and a dad? It's already happening. Recently eight healthy babies were born in the United Kingdom with a fertility technique using DNA from three individuals. The technique was used to enable women with chromosomal disorders to give birth to babies with no known genetic defects.

Scientists are making rapid progress in their quest to find new treatments for autoimmune disorders, heart failure, viral infections and other diseases. They are inserting "synthetic human DNA" into skin cells to allow them to experiment on a more advanced level. But their ultimate goal is to construct entire human chromosomes. Theoretically, it could lead to the creation of fully synthetic humans. Would a fully synthetic human have a soul? Such advances raise serious spiritual, ethical, and legal questions.

In-vitro gametogenesis (IVG) is the creation of human sperm and eggs from skin or blood cells. It is anticipated that this process is only a few years away from allowing two men, two women or possibly more than two individuals to create a child. What are the legal ramifications when the traditional family is replaced in this manner?

How long will it take for synthetic humans to become commodities? Some scientists are now talking about using gene editing and embryo screening to produce smarter, stronger and more attractive babies. How arrogant! Obviously, they have no belief in God or value the souls He creates in His image. Have they heard of the law of unintended consequences? Editing genes to create one set of characteristics could result in other features or problems that were never anticipated. Fortunately, some of the scientists who are involved in this research have expressed such reservations because the results are unpredictable. Will the benefits of this technology outweigh its harmful effects?

Those supporting reverence for human life must be the first to ask the important questions raised by IVG. What does it mean to be a human being created in God's image? Why are traditional families so important? How far do we go in pursuing this technology before we cross boundaries that should be reserved for God alone? How do we go about keeping such technology within appropriate boundaries?

Psalm 139 beautifully describes God lovingly knitting us together in our mother's womb. He knows the days formed for us. He has us in His thoughts continually. Isaiah 55 reminds us that His wisdom far exceeds our limited human minds: "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways, declares the Lord. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts."
