From my heart to yours:

In recent companion sermons, I raised two questions: "What Kind of People Will We Be?" Then, "What Kind of Church Will We Be?" The focus now is on specific areas of church life and individual faith expression that we all need.



During January the emphasis has been on prayer. I have preached on prayer and Verne shared some powerful presentations on prayer in our Wednesday night Bible Studies. We all know we should pray for one another, for those who are sick, who are bereaved, or who face some other life crisis. But what about prayer that God might manifest his "mighty works" among and through us? Beginning January 25, we launched a "Mighty Works Prayer Time." The time and place are Sunday mornings at 9 AM and in the Church Parlor. See page 7 of this Banner to learn more about how you can become involved.

During February I will preach on ways in which we can share our faith. We are all called to be witnesses (Acts 1:8). Probably the best approach for most of us is "friendship evangelism." It involves getting to know others and then looking for opportunities to share Christ with them. Certainly, it means inviting them to come to church with you. We are designating February 22 as "Bring-a-Friend Sunday." You will hear more about this as we prepare for this important day.

Prayer, witnessing, and Bible reading are basics in the Christian life. During the month of March, we will center our attention on reading the New Testament

through from beginning to end. This will involve a time commitment. You may need to spend less time reading the newspaper or your favorite mystery or novel. But what a blessing you will receive from this experience.



2026 FLOWER CALENDAR

RMD stands for **Required Minimum Distribution**, the mandatory annual withdrawal amount from most tax-deferred retirement accounts (like traditional IRAs, 401(k)s, 403(b)s) once you reach a

certain age, currently 73 for most people, though the first withdrawal can be delayed until April 1st of the year after you turn 73. RMDs are calculated using your prior year-end account balance and IRS life expectancy tables, and failing to take them results in stiff penalties.

Who Needs to Take RMDs?

- Owners of traditional IRAs, SEP IRAs, and SIMPLE IRAs.
- Participants in employer-sponsored plans like 401(k)s, profit-sharing plans, 403(b)s, and 457(b)s (unless still working for that employer and not a 5% owner).

THRASH SCHOLARSHIP AVAILABLE



Ouachita Baptist University is accepting applications for the Lloyd and Vesta Thrash Scholarship. If you, your child, grandchild or great-grandchild will be attending OBU in the 2026-2027 school year and would like to apply, please call the church office. Recommendations must be given to the University Scholarship Committee on or before February 15.

There has not been a single year since the scholarship was established when someone related to a member of BRBC has not benefited from the scholarship.

When Do You Start?

- **Age 73:** For most people who turned 72 in 2023 or later.
- **First RMD Deadline:** April 1st of the year after you turn 73 (you'll take two RMDs in that year).
- **Subsequent RMDs:** By December 31st of each year thereafter.

Talk to your financial planner and see how much money you can save on taxes by having their office send money directly to your church for your tithe. It can be done monthly, quarterly or even yearly in one check.

MIGHTY WORKS PRAYER TIME

The first verses of Mark chapter 6 record a disappointing visit by Jesus to his hometown of Nazareth. After speaking in the synagogue the comments were dismissive, “Isn’t this the carpenter?” Verse 5 gives the results, “He could do no mighty work there, except lay his hands on a few sick people and heal them.”

We are amazed, usually suspicious, if someone is healed from any disease. We pray for healing; in fact most of our corporate prayer time is for healing. Look closely at Mark 6:5—turns out our healing is not a mighty work of God. That’s a little disturbing. What we want most often, what we pray for most often, God says is not a mighty work.

What is a mighty work of God? God didn’t send Jesus to heal people; healing was a sign of messiahship. God sent Jesus to save us now and forever.

We are God’s church, God’s family, but we cannot see God’s mighty work unless we are praying for those works. **Mighty Works Prayer Time** is designed for the very purpose of asking God to do mighty works in and through Barcelona Road Baptist Church. This is a very deliberate, focused, and guided prayer time for our church to ask for God’s presence, power and actions right here.

You are invited to pray with us. We will meet in the Parlor Sunday mornings at 9:00 AM and be out in time for Sunday School.


