Fall Sermon Series

A gardener was tending roses on a beautiful estate. A visitor admired his work for awhile and then said, "Your master must love roses." Back came the reply, "I have never met my master." "But everything is in perfect order as though he might return at any moment," the visitor observed. The gardener wisely replied, "He might."

According to the New Testament way of thinking, every hour could be the last hour. The Lord could return at any moment, or he could call us home to heaven. Therefore, we need to be about doing God's will.

During worship on Sunday mornings in September and October, I will preach on the "Fruit of the Spirit" set forth in Galatians 5:22-23. The series is titled "Fruit Always in Season." Here is the list: Love, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Goodness, Faithfulness, Gentleness, and Self-Control. I believe these Christian qualities or graces should be evident in our lives. We don't just profess our faith, we also practice it daily.

We are to bear fruit. Jesus said, "Herein is my father glorified that you bear much fruit" (John 15:8). Notice it is "fruit" singular. We can't pick or choose which of the nine qualities we want to practice. It is all or nothing. You can't say, "I love others," and not be kind or gentle. And so it goes.

Consider also that it is the fruit of the Spirit. The ability to live it comes from Him. Left to ourselves, we will fail to bear the intended fruit.

Finally, this "Fruit Always in Season" is a portrait of Christ. We will want to be like Him and serve as He served.

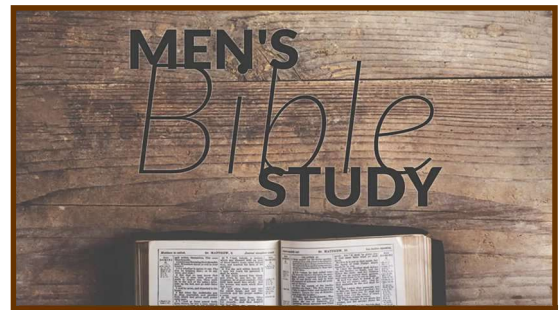

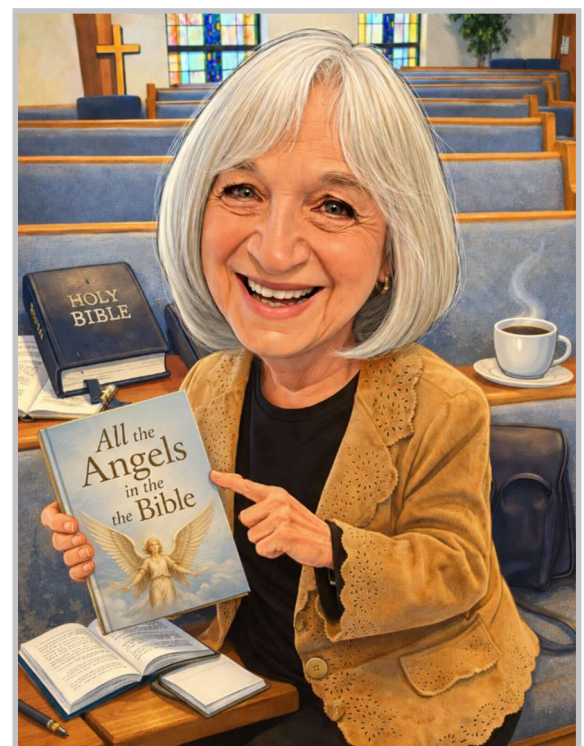

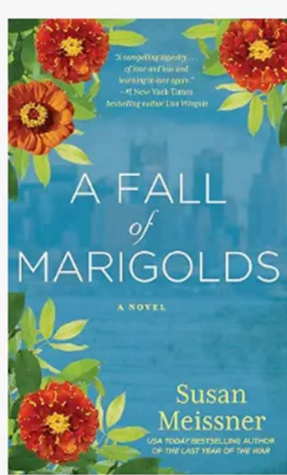

A Fall of Marigolds by Susan Meissner - A beautiful scarf connects two women touched by tragedy in this compelling, emotional novel from the author of *As Bright as Heaven* and *The Last Year of the War*.

September, 1911. On Ellis Island in New York Harbor, nurse Clara Wood cannot face returning to Manhattan where the man she loved fell to his death in the Triangle Shirtwaist Fire. Then, while caring for a fevered immigrant whose own loss mirrors hers, she becomes intrigued by a name embroidered onto the scarf he carries...and finds herself caught in a dilemma that compels her to confront the truth about the assumptions she's made. What she learns could devastate her—or free her.

September, 2011. On Manhattan's Upper West Side, widow Taryn Michaels has convinced herself that she is living fully, working in a charming specialty fabric store and raising her daughter alone. Then a long-lost photograph appears in a national magazine and she is forced to relive the terrible day her husband died in the collapse of the World Trade Towers...the same day a stranger reached out and saved her. But a chance reconnection and a century-old scarf may open Taryn's eyes to the larger forces at work in her life.
