#### From my heart to yours:

Bob Hope, the well-known comedian, recalled how poor his family was when he was growing up. He said they were so poor that they didn't get presents at Christmas, but on Christmas Eve they



would hang up their stockings, and sure enough, the next morning they would be nice and dry!

He added that his folks couldn't afford toys for Christmas. So, every Christmas Eve after everyone was in bed, his father would tear an extra page off the wall calendar in the kitchen. When the kids came down the stairs the next morning, his father would point to the calendar and say, "Look, it's December 26. Where were you kids yesterday? You missed Christmas."

Do you know the story about George Mason? He was someone else who missed Christmas. George had become so involved in his work that it had become a preoccupation with him. He lived alone and preferred it that way. One Christmas he refused all invitations that came to him, even one from his brother's family who had invited him to dinner. He concluded that his nieces and nephews were too noisy and rowdy, and besides he would feel obligated to buy presents for them. Frankly, he just didn't want to be bothered.

After all the employees had left work on Christmas Eve, George walked inside the office vault to get a little extra cash. Suddenly, he heard an automatic click, and the vault door closed securely behind him. There he was all alone in total darkness. In desperation, he pounded on the door but nobody could hear him. They were all gone.

At first George feared that he might suffocate in the vault. But then he remembered there was an air vent that would sustain him. All that was left to do was to sit on the floor and wait out the endless hours.

Christmas Eve and Christmas Day passed. He was certainly alone, but not as he had planned. He grew tired, hungry, and thirsty. Would this ordeal ever end?

The day after Christmas, an employee unlocked the vault but did not open the door. Unnoticed, George staggered out of the vault, slipped out the back door of the office and went home to freshen up. Back at the office, it was business as usual. Nobody bothered to ask how he had spent Christmas. But George learned an important lesson. This is what he wrote on a large display card for all to see: "To love people, to be indispensable somewhere, this is the purpose of life. This is the secret to happiness."

Of course, it is not physically possible to miss Christmas! But some will miss the meaning of Christmas. In the words of Paul Scherer, it is the time when "God came down the stairway of heaven with a baby in his arms." Jesus Christ came into this world to save us from our sins and to offer eternal life. He also has called us to love and serve others.

Plan to be present for all the services during Advent. May the Christ of Christmas rule in our hearts and lives.


