FEBUARY MEMORY VERSE

"Jesus Christ the same yesterday, and today, and forever."

~Hebrews 13:8, KJV

This is the Day

"This is the day which the Lord hath made; we will rejoice and be glad in it" (Psalm 118:24). Have you discovered this meaningful little verse tucked away in the middle of this



Psalm? It is a prescription for daily living. It is a way of thinking that can transform your life. Underline it in your Bible. Memorize it. Above all, claim it for your very own.

This is one of my favorite verses in the Bible. Someone has called it the "getting up text." It is a better stimulant than a cup of coffee. It claims three things.

First, the verse claims that the focus of our lives should be on this day. Take one day at a time. When going on a trip, it is wise advice to "travel light." The same thing applies to daily living. There are two days in every week in which we are not to live—yesterday and tomorrow. We can turn our past mistakes and future worries over to God and make the most of this day.

Second, this verse claims that each day belongs to God. "This is the day which the Lord hath made." He is the creator and sustainer of life. Our highest goal is to put him first. As Jesus challenged us, "Seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things will be added unto you" (Matthew 6:33).

Finally, this verse claims something about the nature of real happiness. It encourages us to "rejoice and be glad." Mistakenly, some people think that happiness is a matter of outward circumstances. However, genuine happiness is the product of inward adjustment and a firm confidence in God.





If you are 70 1/2, you can make a QCD (Qualified Charitable Distribution) and still claim the standard deduction.

If you are 73 years old or older you must take a Required Minimum Distribution from your IRA. By having your Financial Institution send your withdrawal (limited to \$108,000) directly to a charitable organization, you will not have to pay taxes on this amount.

Talk to your financial planner and see how much money you can save on taxes by having their office send money directly to your church for your tithe. This can be done monthly, quarterly or even yearly in one check.

Avoid paying capital gains on stock sales by donating the stock to the church. Call the church office for more information.

This month, we are highlighting two books from Melanie Dickerson's "Medieval Fairy Tale Series". The Orphan's Wish

An enchanting new version of the well-known fairy tale, The Orphan's Wish tells a story of courage and loyalty, friendship and love, and reminds us what "family" really means.

This is a historical retelling of the story of Aladdin set in Medieval Germany. Orphaned and alone, Aladdin travels from the streets of his Arab homeland to a strange, faraway place. Growing up in an orphanage, he meets young Lady Kirstyn, whose father is the powerful Duke of Hagenheim. Despite their differences, Aladdin quickly becomes Kirstyn's favorite companion and their childhood friendship grows into a bond that time and opposition cannot break.

The Noble Servant

The impossible was happening. Magdalen of Mallin was to marry the Duke of Wolfberg. Such a marriage was the only way she could save her people from starvation. But why would a handsome, wealthy duke want to marry her, a poor baron's daughter? It seemed too good to be true. On the journey to Wolfberg Castle, Magdalen's servant forces her to trade places and become her servant, threatening not only Magdalen's life but the lives of those she holds dear. Stripped of her identity and title, Magdalen of Mallin is sentenced to tend geese while she watches her former handmaiden gain all she had ever dreamed of

When a handsome shepherd befriends her, Magdalen begins to suspect he carries secrets of his own. Together, Magdalen and the shepherd uncover a sinister plot against Wolfberg and the duke.


