Farewell to Willard and Juel

It is almost time to say “Good-bye” to Willard and Juel Zeiser.

Perhaps this statement is too strong. Having served at BRBC as Interim Pastor (2013) and as Associate Pastor (2014-2025), this beloved couple will be close by in Hot Springs. We look forward to continuing contact and fellowship with them.

Willard has had a long, fruitful span of ministry in local churches and our denomination. He completed his college work at Oklahoma Baptist University, followed by his seminary education at Southwestern Seminary. Although he never wanted to be called “Doctor,” Hannibal La-Grange College in Missouri honored him with a Doctor of Philosophy degree.

Willard has served in varied roles in churches. Early on, he served as Minister of Youth at the First Baptist Churches of Abilene and San Angelo, Texas. He then became Minister of Education/Administration at Park Hill Baptist Church in North Little Rock and Wilshire Baptist Church in Dallas, followed by the Associate Pastor role at First Baptist Church, Oklahoma City.

On the denominational side, Willard was Program Coordinator and Associate Executive Director of the Missouri Baptist Convention. In this role he invested time and energy in local churches and coordinated mission trips overseas.

Willard brought this rich background and experience to us, when he and Juel came to BRBC. It has been a joy and privilege for me to serve with him in a joint pastoral role. We have alternated days in visiting hospitals and ministering to church families. He has endeared himself to our homebound members with his faithful contacts and cheerful phone calls. We have stood together with families during times of crisis and bereavement. It is evident that he has a heart and love for people. We both are grateful for deacons who fulfill the New Testament role and have joined their pastors in caring for our church families, thus making our jobs easier.

Willard has served on various committees and given leadership to our commitment to missions.

He has challenged us to give generously to our special mission offerings. Above all, Willard is an outstanding preacher and teacher. He has faithfully filled the pulpit in my absence and inspired and challenged the congregation with his Wednesday night Bible studies.

Willard also possesses the gift of decorating. In addition to his special touches elsewhere in the church buildings, he has decorated my office every Christmas with greenery and poinsettias. He has carefully instructed me on how to water the plants to keep them alive. He did not always succeed!

Willard and Juel make a faithful team. In her quiet way, she has lovingly ministered by his side over the years. At BRBC she has invested her life in ministry with our children on Sunday morning, Wednesday evenings, and during Vacation Bible School. She knows the children by name and is genuinely interested in their families. Juel is also an excellent cook and gracious hostess.

Most mornings Willard and Juel walk in their neighborhood. One morning a police car passed by and they waved. The officer backtracked, rolled down his window, and informed them, “I believe I need to ticket you for walking too fast in the Village.”

We are grateful that Willard and Juel now will be able to slow their pace a bit! May the Lord bless them as they enter a new phase of their lives.

A memorial service will held on Sunday, May 25. A vase of roses will be arranged as each name is called out and a picture of the deceased will be shown.

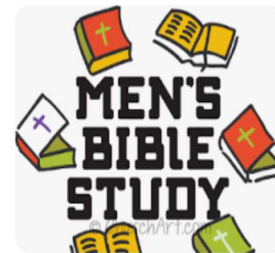
We will also memorialize those who have sacrificed their lives for our country and celebrate the Lord's Supper on that day.

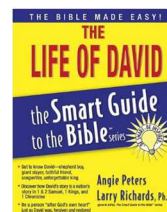

On Good Friday, April 18, Holly Anderson shared the powerful and often heart-wrenching story of the accident in 2022 which caused Terry Lee's traumatic brain injury.

While often sad and moving, Holly didn't dwell on that part of the story. She shared with an audience of almost 100 the miracles that God has done (and is continuing to do) during this journey. The first is that Terry Lee defied all odds and lived! He suffered cardiac arrest and had multiple internal injuries as well as broken bones in his leg and wrist. He has undergone 22 surgeries since that time and has to have physical therapy daily to try to help him improve.

Through this continuing struggle, the entire Anderson family has grown closer to God and understand on a personal level what God went through when His son Jesus suffered and died on the cross for each one of us.

A Question of Faith - Three families find themselves at a crossroads, questioning their faith and the God that guides their lives. As each family member deals with their issues, their worlds start to intertwine. This leads to a chain of events, which unknowingly brings the three families closer and closer together. Will the families give in to the loss, pain, and uncertainty that has shattered their lives or will they find the tie that binds them all together through hope, trust, redemption and goodwill?

Heroes of the Bible -

Samson, empowered by God with supernatural strength, endangers his destiny with impulsive decisions that lead to betrayal by a wicked prince and a beautiful temptress. When Samson calls on his God once more, he turns imprisonment and blindness into final victory.

Taken into slavery after the fall of Jerusalem in 605 B.C., *Daniel* (Robert Miano) is forced to serve the most powerful king in the world, King Nebuchadnezzar. With his life at stake, Daniel has nothing but his faith to stand between him and the lions' den.

Righteous Jew Mordecai and the despicable Haman square off for control of the young Persian King Xerxes. It is up to Mordecai's niece *Esther* to win the affection of the King, unmask Haman's treachery and save the Jewish people.

Two Jailers at the ancient Mamertine Prison take custody of Simon *Peter of Galilee*—apostle, disciple, and personal friend of Jesus, also called The Christ. Condemned to death, the elderly Peter (Robert Loggia) recounts his life as a simple fisherman who became one of the boldest figures in all of Christianity.

A Biblical story from the archives of the royal Jewish bloodline, this story of *Esther* reveals the redemption of their inheritance through the child Obed, who was the grandfather of King David.

Pardoned by Grace - Based on the true story of Scott Highberger, who transformed from a life of addiction and crime into a prison ministry, the film showcases his journey and how he found faith, ultimately leading to his unlikely pardon to continue his ministry.

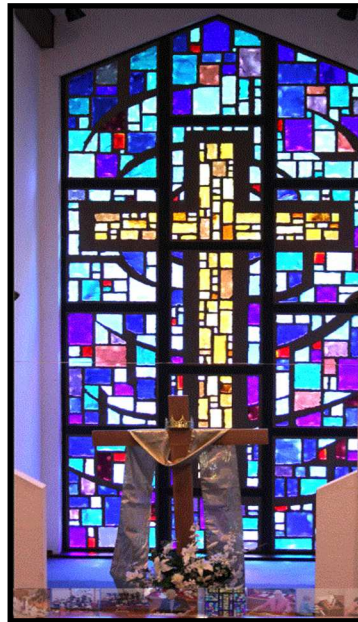
