Sometimes They Do

James Alfred Wight (1916-1995), better known by his pen name as James Herriot, lived in Thirsk, England, twenty-five miles north of York. He was a veterinarian by profession but also a gifted writer who related many of his exciting experiences in books, including All Creatures Great and Small, and developed in the popular series on PBS television.

Graham Lord, in James Herriot: The Life of a Country Vet, tells an unusual story about how Dr. Wight was treating a cat with a certain procedure one day. He anesthetized the cat with chloroform and cotton in a jam jar. Unfortunately, the cat had a heart attack and died. Wight (Herriot) had learned in veterinary college that one way to jump start the heart is to swing the cat quickly by its tail. The procedure sounds ridiculous, but evidently it works on some occasions. So, Herriot went outside the clinic and swung the cat around and around by its tail. As fate would have it, he let go and the cat flew away through the air and disappeared over the garden wall. Herriot looked all around but couldn't find the cat anywhere.

A week later a fellow who was living three doors down came in to see Dr. Wight. He reported, "I was sitting in the garden the other day reading the paper, and all of a sudden this cat jumped at me from the top of the tree and hit me on the back of the neck and killed itself. Herriot just smiled and replied, "Sometimes they do!"

We encounter unusual, unexplained things all the time. Upon closer examination,

we can find answers to some of them. But for other things that happen to us, we can't make any sense of them. About these occurrences, we have to conclude, "Sometimes they do!"

The apostle Paul reminds us that now "we see in a mirror dimly, but then (when we get to heaven) face to face" (1 Corinthians 13:12). The Old Testament prophet Habakkuk lived in troubled times. War, famine, and pestilence were the order of the day. How long would the situation continue? Habakkuk didn't receive the answer he wanted but learned as must we that "the righteous shall live by faith" (2:4).




Each session is stand-alone so come whenever you can.



Yard work and gardening are Stan's passion and pass time since he had to give up golf. Donna enjoys card groups and visiting her siblings in Mississippi.


They joined New Horizons Sunday School Class and are in Jim Webb's deacon group. Stan is an ordained deacon.

Becoming Elisabeth Elliot by Ellen Vaughn -



Elisabeth Elliot was a young missionary in Ecuador when members of a violent Amazonian tribe savagely speared her husband Jim and his four colleagues. Incredibly, prayerfully, Elisabeth took her toddler daughter, snakebite kit, Bible, and journal... and lived in the jungle with the Stone-Age people who killed her husband. Compelled by her friendship and forgiveness, many came to faith in Jesus.


This is the story of a hilarious, brilliant, witty, self-deprecating, sensitive, radical, and surprisingly relatable person utterly submitted to doing God's will, no matter how high the cost. For Elisabeth, the central question was not, "How does this make me feel?" but, simply, "is this true?" If so, then the next question was, "what do I need to do about it to obey God?"

"My life is on Thy Altar, Lord—for Thee to consume. Set the fire, Father! Bind me with cords of love to the Altar. Hold me there. Let me remember the Cross." - Elisabeth Elliot, age 21
