FEBRUARY MEMORY VERSE

"And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are called according to His purpose."

Romans 8:28, KJV

From my heart to yours:

"This is the day which the Lord hath made; we will rejoice and be glad in it" (Psalm 118:24). Have you discovered this meaninaful

you discovered this meaningful little verse tucked away in the middle of this Psalm? It is a prescription for daily living. It is a way of thinking which can transform your life. Underline it in your Bible. Memorize it. Above all, claim it as your very own. Let it speak to your life.

This is one of my favorite verses in the Bible. Someone has called it the "getting-up text." It is a better stimulant than a cup of coffee! Let's take the verse apart and examine it. It claims at least three important things.

First, this verse claims that the focus of our lives should be on this day. Take one day at a time. When going on a long trip, it is wise advice to "travel light." The same thing applies to daily living. There are two days in every week in which we are not to live—yesterday and tomorrow. Yet some people submerge themselves in the past. They talk about the "good old days," or they dwell on some past sin or failure. Either way, they miss the joy of the present. Others live in the future. They dream of the "golden tomorrow," or they worry about what may happen to them. Again, the present is robbed of its happiness and fulfillment. I am convinced that we were not programmed by God to live in all three tenses at the same time—past, present, and future. With God as your guide, determine that you are going to make the most of this day.

Second, this verse claims that each day belongs to God. "This is the day which the Lord hath made." To accept today as God-given is to affirm that He is Lord of life. Our highest goal is to put Him first in all things. As Jesus challenged, "Seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you" (Matthew 6:33).

What is the priority of your life? Somewhere I heard about a modest, ordinary souvenir shop with a sign standing out front containing this eyecatching advertisement: Trash, Trinkets and Treasures. Perhaps these three descriptive words have something to say about our scheme of values.

Many people embrace a "trash" level, hardly rising above an animal-like existence. Sensual pleasures are the focus of their attention. Then there are those who give themselves to the "trinkets" of life. These ae good people who become involved in many worthwhile activities and causes. However, they often neglect spiritual things and fail to give God a significant place in their lives.

Finally, there are those who discern the real "treasures" which give life continuity and meaning. Jesus Christ is the object of their affection. His life and teachings become the standard by which they measure their conduct. Spiritual things take precedence over material things. They are aware that only what is accomplished for Christ will weather the test of time and last into eternity.

Third, this verse claims something about the nature of real happiness. Notice it challenges us to "rejoice and be glad." Everyone wants to be happy, but some never achieve this reality. Mistakenly, they think that happiness is a matter of favorable circumstances. But happiness results when we surrender ourselves to God's will, so that each day is dedicated to serving him. Life cannot be compartmentalized into the categories of sacred and secular. All of life is sacred.

Once Francis of Assisi was hoeing his garden. A visitor stopped by and asked what he would do if he was told that he would die at sunset that very day. He wisely replied, "I would finish hoeing my garden." This dedicated man of God exemplified the spirit of our text, "This is the day which the Lord hath made." It is his and so am I. Therefore, I can "rejoice and be glad in it."

Beginning Thursday, February 15, Barcelona Road Baptist Church will host the GriefShare Program. The GriefShare Program is a special weekly (13 sessions) seminar and support group designed to help one rebuild his/her life after losing a loved one. The GriefShare Program is Biblically based. The group is led by caring people who have experienced grief and want to help you through the difficult days ahead.

GriefShare is a video-based support group. GriefShare is built around three components:

The Video Seminar Portion offers expert teaching on topics important to people in grief.

The Small Group Discussion Component allows participants to discuss how the video concepts relate to their own experiences. Sharing is voluntary. Trained facilitators will lead these sessions.

The Workbook Portion provides a video note-taking tool and a daily Bible study for personal study, journaling, and application of concepts presented on the videos.

The personal Bible study is necessary to allow time to reflect on and apply the scriptural truths participants are learning to their lives. The Bible Study is separated into five parts and is planned for completion on five separate days between sessions

Who should attend these sessions? Grieving people in BRBC and in the community are welcome to come to the sessions to find practical help and a place to connect with others. We encourage anyone who has lost a loved one to come for at least three sessions to see if GriefShare can be of help to you. We will be meeting on Thursday Mornings from 9:30 to 11:30 in the Fellowship Hall of BRBC. Facilitators for these sessions are Priscilla Guillion and Ann Webb.

Book Doctor by Esther Cohen Smart - Independent, quirky, and well-read, Arlette Rosen makes her living helping people write the books they've always dreamed of and she's quite good at it. She likes this work, likes the freedom of someone else's sentences, likes being able to change, in intuitive ways only she knows, small details here and there. By the time she meets new client Harbinger Singh, she has worked on sixty-four books, chosen from hundreds of submissions. Harbinger Singh makes his living as a tax attorney, but what he really wants to do is write a novel, a grand, sweeping saga he intends to call Hot and Dusty. The romance that blooms between these two unlikely lovers triggers something in each that just might be called hope. With uncompromising wit and a fierce tenderness, Esther Cohen has written a modern-day comedy of manners about relationships, writer's block, and the enduring--if elusive --creative spirit.

Mountains of Grace by Kelly Irvin - Mercy Yoder loves her students and her life in the tiny village of West Kootenai, nestled at the foot of Montana's most northern mountains. She is in no rush to get married...in fact, she has turned down the one marriage proposal. Her beau, Caleb, has yet to tell her he loves her, stoking her fears that they simply aren't right for each other.

When a devastating wildfire threatens to destroy her community, Mercy and her family evacuate to the nearby town of Eureka. There she meets Spencer McDonald, an "Englisch" smoke jumper. Her conversations with him are unlike any she's ever had with a man. She finds his directness and ability to express his feelings refreshing and completely different from Caleb, who is tightlipped about his past.

But what would her family and community say if Mercy chose a relationship with an Englischer? Is Mercy willing to give up all she has known and loved for someone who finally understands her? Or can Mercy find the love she has always longed for closer to home?

Beneath the Summer Sun by Kelly Irvin - It's been four years since Jennie's husband died in a farming accident. Long enough that the elders in her Amish community think it's time to marry again for the sake of her seven children. What they don't know is that grief isn't holding her back from a new relationship. Fear is. A terrible secret in her past keeps her from moving forward.

Mennonite book salesman Nathan Walker stops by Jennie's farm whenever he's in the area. Despite years of conversation and dinners together, she never seems to relax around him. He knows he should move on, but something about her keeps drawing him back.

Meanwhile, Leo Graber nurtures a decades-long love for Jennie, but guilt plagues him—guilt for letting Jennie marry someone else and guilt for his father's death on a hunting trip many years ago. How could anyone love him again—and how could he ever take a chance to love in return?
