




A paramedic by profession, Billy retired in Texas, but then worked for a time in both the Village and Hot Springs as a paramedic.


Billy joined the church by letter on April 7. Abiah and Elijah were baptized on April 21.



King of the Crown Imperials: Inspired by the Story of Queen Esther by Joanna Alonzo — A royal internship in the island country of Ancoria is the perfect way for Vivienne to end her year-long journey across the world. She gets more than she bargained for when the internship requires her to pretend to be the prince's fiancé. This story is a fresh take on the Biblical story of Esther (not a retelling, but inspired by the story of Esther). Will their farce of an engagement succeed in shielding the kingdom from its enemies? Or will the lies reduce their faith, love, and country to ashes? Danger lurks everywhere. This book combines romance and a happy ending with fantasy elements and the serious themes of war, genocide, faith, and integrity.

To the Moon and Back (Baxter Family Collection) by Karen Kingsbury—Two people who lost their parents in the same national tragedy—two people desperate to find each other and the connection they shared for a single day...that changed everything. Brady Bradshaw was a child when the Oklahoma City bombing killed his mother. Every year, Brady visits the memorial site on the anniversary to remember her. Eleven years ago on that day, he met Jenna Phillips, who was also a child when her parents were killed in the attack. Brady and Jenna shared a deep connection and a single beautiful day together at the memorial, but after that, Brady never saw Jenna again. Every year when he returns, he leaves a note for her in hopes that he might find her again. An unlikely love story about healing, redemption, hope, and the belief that sometimes a new tomorrow can grow from the ashes of a shattered yesterday.
