From my heart to yours:

2024 Church Budget

The congregation will be called into brief business session at the conclusion of Marning W.

the conclusion of Morning Worship on November 5 to vote on the 2024 Operating Budget. The proposed budget is \$572,861 and represents a slight increase over the current 2023 budget. Thank you for your faithful giving to the programs and ministries of the church.

The Importance of Giving Thanks

A story is told about a monastery where all of the brothers took a disciplined vow of total silence. In their journey of complete obedience, they were not allowed to speak a single word. There was, however, one exception. Once every five years, they were permitted to speak two words to the Abbot who headed the order.

A new monk arrived at the monastery to begin his service. After five years, he went to the Abbot's office to speak his first two words. His words were, "Food bad!" He then got up from his chair and left. Five years later, he returned to speak again. This time, his words were, "Bed hard!" After another five year period, he returned for a third time. Now his two words were, "Want out!"

"Well, I'm certainly not surprised," said the Abbot. "All you've ever done since you've been here is to complain." As we look around our world, there are lots of things we can complain about. But there is also much to be thankful for!

Benjamin Franklin recalled an experience from his boyhood. He told about the old salt barrel that stood in the corner of the kitchen. Meat was taken from the barrel daily to provide for the family's needs. Franklin's father prayed at every meal: "Thank thee, Father, for the meat thou hast laid before us." One day young Ben managed enough courage to suggest: "Father, why don't we say thanks for the

whole barrel at one time and be done with it?" Commenting on this experience years later, Franklin said he would never forget the stern rebuke of his father for such presumptuous ingratitude!

We observe Thanksgiving Day once each year. We dump the blessings of 364 days into one Thanksgiving Day and piously express our gratitude to God. It would be much more appropriate to set aside one day each year for grumbling and complaining and reserve the remaining 364 days for thanksgiving. We need to be thankful not just now but throughout the year.

Moses in Deuteronomy shared an appropriate word. "When you have eaten and are satisfied, praise the Lord your God for the good land he has given you. Be careful that you do not forget the Lord your God, failing to observe his commands, his laws and his decrees that I am giving you this day. Otherwise, when you eat and are satisfied, when you build fine houses and settle down, and when your herds and flocks grow large and your silver and gold increase and all you have is multiplied, then your heart will become proud and you will forget the Lord your God, who brought you out of Egypt, out of the land of slavery" (Deuteronomy 8:10-14, NIV).

Like the Israelites, we need to remember to thank God from whom all blessings flow!


