From my heart to yours:

Giving has a bad reputation. The most often criticism of the church is, "All they talk about is money." Many preachers approach the annual steward-ship/budget preparation season with fear and trembling. Some begin their sermons with an apology that they have to



mention money again. It is a standing joke that

Baptists cannot have a service without passing the offering plate. One young police recruit who happened to be the son of a Baptist minister was asked during an examination, "How would you scatter a mob?" Without hesitation he replied: "I would take off my hat and start taking a collection."

Giving, however, is not a subject to sidestep. It is not an obligation to endure, like going to the dentist for a regular check-up. Giving is an opportunity to get in on what God is doing. Giving enables us to share God's greatest gift with others. Giving also brings joy to our lives.

It is important for us to learn to give regularly. Paul introduced this concept in writing to the Corinthians when he commanded, "On the first day of every week, each one of you should set aside a sum of money in keeping with his income" (1 Corinthians 16:2). This offering is given for the Lord's work through the church.

Some people give sporadically. They give when they feel like it, when they think about it, when they happen to have some money left over at the end of the month, when a guilty conscience prods them, or when the Finance Committee of the church makes an urgent plea. Unless we discipline ourselves to follow a regular, systematic, faithful pattern of giving, the Lord's work will suffer and we will surely miss out on many wonderful blessings and joys the Lord has prepared for us.

A preacher took his car to a mechanic for service. The mechanic seized the opportunity to voice gripes about the church. One of his complaints had to do with what he called a constant emphasis on giving. "All I hear is give, give, give. I'm sick and tired of hearing this. I believe a person ought to give when he feels like it."

The preacher said nothing, but when the mechanic finished with the car and submitted his bill, the preacher just handed him some change. The mechanic asked, "What's this?" Replied the preacher, "This is

what I am giving you for fixing my car." The mechanic protested, "Wait a minute. The bill is far more than you have given me." The preacher answered, "I know, but that's all I feel like giving you."

The mechanic reacted with agitation. "You don't know how much it costs to operate this business. I have rent to pay on this building. I have to pay monthly utilities. I have to pay my employees. I have to buy equipment and maintain it. All this costs money."

The preacher then replied, "Well, if you think you can come to church and give what you want when you feel like it, and the church can operate on that, certainly something as small as your automobile repair shop can operate on the same basis!"

We will not be obedient to God's purpose and plan for giving until we commit ourselves to a regular, systematic, and generous pattern of sharing in the Lord's work through the church. God wants us to give the first fruits, not the leftovers.




