From my heart to yours:

Fred Craddock, who taught at Emory, tells about his experience as the young pastor of a small church outside Oak Ridge, Tennessee. It was a wonderful time when atomic energy was expanding. Workers came from everywhere to help with the Oak Ridge Project. Mobile home parks sprang up as hard hats moved in with their trucks and families.



Craddock was pastor of a beautiful, gleaming-white church located on a hill. The pews had been hand-hewn from giant poplar trees in the area. Kerosene lights were attached to the walls. Every Sunday, the faithful gathered, and Miss Mary played the pump organ, just as slowly as possible.

One Sunday, Craddock called the deacons together and said, "Brethren, we've got to do something about all these people moving in. We need an outreach program for them." But there was dead silence. Finally, one of the deacons said, "Oh, preacher, I don't know. I don't believe they would fit in here." Someone else chimed in, "They're just temporary. Construction people, you know. They'll soon be moving on." But Craddock persisted, "We ought to minister to them while they are here." Dead silence. Everybody was hungry, so they decided to go home and resume the conversation the next Sunday.

So the next Sunday, Craddock called the deacons together again. Before he had a chance to say anything, the number one deacon in the church said, "I move that nobody can become a member of this church who does not own property in this county." Somebody else uttered a hearty, "Amen. I second the motion." The deacon body voted unanimously, except for that little preacher, and they said his vote didn't count.

Years later, Craddock and his wife were driving through that part of Tennessee and he said, "Let's go by and see the church." But they had a hard time finding it, because the interstate had come through

and things had changed. After stopping to ask directions several times, they finally found the church still at the top of the hill, gleaming-white and beautiful.

But what a difference. The parking lot was jammed with cars, trucks, RVs and motorcycles. People were coming and going like you've never seen. There was a huge sign on the roof. "Barbecue—All you can eat—\$5.95."

Craddock said they went inside. The pews had been moved against the wall. The organ was still there, but in a corner. The kerosene lights had been replaced by electric ones. All around were formica tables with people eating barbecued pork, beef, chicken, and ribs. All kinds of people were there—blacks and whites, young and old, rich and poor. Craddock turned to his wife and said, "You know, it's a good thing this place is not a church any longer, because these people wouldn't be able to come here!"

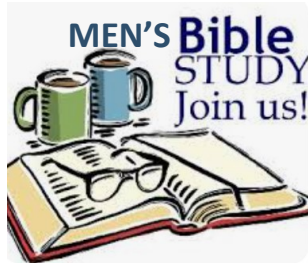

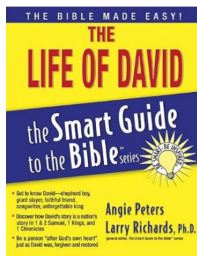

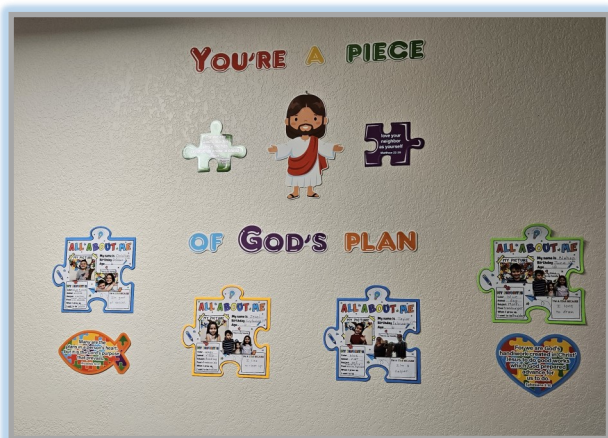
