THE NEW APOSTOLIC REFORMATION



- The New Apostolic Reformation, or NAR, is an unbiblical religious movement that emphasizes experience over scripture, mysticism over doctrine, and modern-day apostles over the plain text of the Bible. Of distinction in the New Apostolic Reformation are the role and power of the spiritual leaders and miracle workers, the reception of new revelations from God, an over—on spiritual warfare, and a pursuit of cultural and political control in society. The seeking of signs and wonders in the NAR is always accompanied by blatantly _______doctrine.¹
- NAR (pronounced nahr) is a movement. NAR is not an organization or a denomination: it consists of churches and other Christian organizations that have developed ______ networks with one another in pursuit of a common mission that is rooted in shared beliefs and realized through distinctive practices.²



KEY BELIEFS AND PRACTICES

»	Apostolic and Prophetic Authority – emphasizes the role of contemporary apostles and prophets		
»	Ministry – Eph. 4:11-13working alongside pastors, teachers, and evangelists		
»	Spiritual Warfare – deliverance ministries, prayer walks, and strategic-level spiritual warfare to combatforces		
»	Theology (Seven Mountain Mandate) – Some adherents believe that Christians should influence seven key areas of society (government, media, education, business, family religion, and arts/entertainment) to establish God's kingdom on earth.		
»	Signs, Wonders, and Miracles – embracesexperiences such as healing, prophecy, and other charismatic gifts		
»	Revival and Church Growth – NAR churches often emphasize revival meetings, evangelistic outreach, and church expansion

•	Dominion Theology: the belief that Christians are called to take authority over society and
	God's Kingdom on earth by influencing key areas of culture, government, and
	business.
•	Systematic Theology: a structured, academic approach toChristian doctrine
	by organizing biblical teachings into clear categories.
•	Stewardship Theology (as a counterpoint): This perspective emphasizes that while Christians
	have a responsibility to care for the world and its resources, they should do so through personal
	and service rather than through seeking political or social dominance.
•	Premillennialism (as a broader context): Dominion theology stands in contrast to standard
	Christian doctrine, also called premillennialism, which suggests Christ must return first
	a Christian kingdom is established on earth.
•	Triumphalism is still evident in certain Christian circles. For example, some Christians believe in
	a form of eschatology that expects the eventual globalof Christianity. Also possessing
	a triumphalist mindset are adherents of dominionism and kingdom now theology. These groups
	believe God wants them to take dominion over all the earth, physically, spiritually, and politically.
	This perspective fosters a belief that Christian values should be imposed on society, often through
	political means, and that the Church is destined to govern the world in a literal sense. ³
