1. In verse 10 of this chapter, we see these words spoken by the bride: "I am my beloved's, And his desire is for me.

Yet in chapter 2, verse 16, she said it like this: "My beloved is mine, and I am his;

What do you notice about the order of these two statements?

In chapter 2, the couple is not yet married and in chapter 7, they have been married for some time. Do you think the difference in these statements might be showing that the Bride has matured in her relationship with her Bridegroom? How so?

- 2. This chapter begins with the Bridegroom talking about the bride's feet. And keep in mind, they are no longer newlyweds. They have been married for some time and have had their share of "fights," but if you notice the Bridegroom focuses on all that is good in his wife. And he starts with her feet.
- 3. It's important to remember that she had been a country girl. Country girls usually have callouses -but he only sees the beauty of her feet. And we need to remember that if we are saved, if we belong to the Lord, He sees us through the blood of His Son perfect in HIM-not covered over in callouses.
- 4. With that in mind, look at what God says about feet:

Isaíah 52:7

F How lovely on the mountains Are the feet of him who brings good news, Who announces peace And brings good news of happiness, Who announces salvation, And says to Zion, "Your God reigns!"
