6. Verses 6 and 7. Talk about the implications of these verses in light of God's love for you:

**For love is as strong as death, jealousy is as severe as Sheol; its flashes are flashes of fire, the very flame of the Lord.
"Many waters cannot quench love, nor will rivers overflow it; if a man were to give all the riches of his house for love, it would be utterly despised."**

7. Read 1 John 2:3-6. Do you know Him? Do you keep His commandments?
