- 2. Discuss how Jesus being the Creator of all things, King of Kings and Lord of Lord's makes Himself available to all in this house.
- 3. Take a moment and list the different groups or people that were present during this miracle.
- 4. Discuss the length the man's friends went to, to get him to Jesus... How does this effort inspire you to do more to get people to Jesus?
- 5. Jesus prioritizes forgiveness of sins over physical healing. Discuss how the eternal is more important that the temporal, and how this tends to go against the nature of man.
- 6. The Bible says the Scribes "Reasoned in their hearts" while Jesus "Perceived in His spirit" discuss the contrast. (vs. 6-8)
- 7. The phrase "Power on earth to forgive sins" (vs 10) is significant, why?
- 8. According to vs 12, the man's "New walk" resulted in people glorifying God... How does this relate to the newness of our walk mentioned in Romans 6:4?
