- 1. What were the names of Timothy's grandmother and mother?
- 2. What is known about Timothy's dad- (see Acts 16:1)
- 3. What was meant when Paul said, "Let no man despise your youth"? (1 Tim. 4:12)
- 4. Looking back into Acts 16:1-5, why do you think Paul had Timothy observe the law by being circumcised, after in Acts 15 Paul had argued that gentile believers need not worry with following Moses law?
- 5. In what ways was Timothy expected to be a "Steward" (vs 1-2)?
