Adult Christian Care Update

As I reflect back on 2023, I continue to be amazed at the kindness and faithful support for ACC from St. Paul Lutheran Church. All of us here at ACC wish we could find the perfect way to say thank you. We are so grateful for your generosity. A special thanks to Laura Albert, Marion Hammerel and Daniel Rubalcaba for their multiple visits to drop off these donations.

With many new members at St. Paul, I thought a little refresher as to who we are would be fitting. Adult Christian Care (ACC), is a not-for-profit memory care day program, located in Epiphany Lutheran Church in Elmhurst. The program is under the direction of a Certified Dementia Practitioner, bringing life enriching and therapeutic activities to seniors with memory/cognitive impairment. Adult Christian Care was established in 1978 to offer a safe, structured and stimulating alternative for seniors that have some form of dementia or Alzheimer's disease. Seniors that can remain at home, yet may be battling loneliness, have reduced physical activity, or who are bored, have the opportunity to engage in a full day of enriching activity and companionship. ACC also serves as a respite for caregivers and families who need to work, attend to personal business, or just relax.

Two members of our congregation serve on the Board of Directors, John Freidheim and Karen Egan. Karen also volunteers her time by playing the piano and creating sing-a-longs with our clients. And of course, Pastor Zak, who is always there to lend an ear and provide great ideas.

Lastly, I will be stepping down from the Director position to relocate to Virginia. We have hired a new Director, and her name is Jamie Basso, CDP. Jamie not only comes to us with experience in Long Term Care, senior living, and dementia, she adds a flare to our existing program with a background in economics, business development and marketing. Jamie is also a Certified Dementia Practitioner. I want to say thank you for the support, love, and kindness I received here at St. Paul. I am beyond grateful.

Confirmation will be held on Pentecost Sunday, May 19th and will take place at the 10am worship service. Please contact *Roxanne* with any questions.


Honor the Grads Sunday—June 2nd


