








Book Club

We cannot believe how quickly March has come and gone. This month was jammed packed with lots of learning, new toys and fun events.

To start the month, we had a Dr. Seuss Spirit Week. We had fun, daily themes - and even celebrated with birthday cake, and singing Happy Birthday to Dr. Seuss! One of our favorite spirit days were "dress like you are 100." We had a family night during this theme, and made Oobleck, decorated cupcakes, and several other themed activities.

We received many new items for our program through a Quality Improvement Grant, which will help us reach Silver Level ExceleRate Accreditation. ExceleRate Illinois is a statewide quality recognition and improvement system designed to make continuous quality improvement an everyday priority among early learning providers. The program establishes standards for helping infants, toddlers and preschool age children develop intellectually, physically, socially, and emotionally. It provides a framework for early learning professionals to identify opportunities for improvement, increase their skills and take steps to make positive changes.

This year our Pre-K class took part in the Prayer Vigil on March 15th. The children did a wonderful job participating, and observing silence during their time slot. As we prepare for Easter, we look forward to hearing the rest of Pastor Zak's Lenten Stories during chapel time.
