The above title is actually the name of the new purple-bound worship supplement printed by Augsburg Fortress in 2020. It contains two new liturgical settings, a variety of new prayers and two hundred new hymns (some of which we've been singing in recent months as denoted by "ACS" in our service folder). It would seem as though lately it feels as though "All Creation *Screams*" as we have welcomed our cicada friends from their nearly two decade slumber, and what an arrival it has been. I've gone through all of the stages of this experience, beginning with the curious anticipation, morphing into horrified disbelief, leading into general annoyance at the unrelenting buzz at all times. This is certainly a memorable experience as well as a reminder of the sheer wonder of God's creation and our unique place in it. While I sit here and complain about the destructive and disruptive force of these winged visitors, I am humbly reminded of our own alarming relationship with creation:

"Recent years have seen a rapid increase in awareness and alarm concerning the impact of human activity over the past two hundred years on this planet's ability to sustain the fragile balance necessary for the life God planted here, including human life. Each Sunday as God's people are gathered into and sent from worship, <u>All Creation Sings</u> reminds us how we are integrally part of the whole of creation, marvels at the gifts of creation, and gives thanks for the grace to join the rest of creation's song even as the cosmos joins ours."

Book Club—Summer Schedule



Countdown to Kiss A Pig!






