A Generous Gift Provides Extra Resources to St. Paul

St. Paul now has two AED locations due to the generosity of S.C.A.R.F. and Suburban Dental Medicine of Elgin, IL. You might be asking yourself "what is an AED, who is S.C.A.R.F., and why should I care?" These are all very good questions that deserve an answer. An AED, or an automated external defibrillator, is a medical device that can help people experiencing sudden cardiac arrest. AEDs analyze the heart's rhythm and deliver an electrical shock to help the heart re-establish an effective rhythm. These life-saving

devices provide people experiencing sudden cardiac arrest the hope of survival.

Who is S.C.A.R.F.? <u>S.C.A.R.F.</u> stands for Sudden Cardiac-Death Awareness Research Foundation. It is a non-profit organization dedicated to educating communities about the signs and prevention of sudden cardiac death/arrest. If you click on the underlined letters above you can go directly to the S.C.A.R.F. website and read more about the organization and their important mission.

Why should I care? Well, did you know that sudden cardiac death is the leading cause of death within the United States? Having access to devices like an AED can potentially save a person from sudden cardiac death. Cardiac events happen in people of all ages. This is why we have placed these machines both upstairs and downstairs. And finally, AED's are expensive, ranging anywhere from \$1,400 to \$2,500 per device, and can be cost prohibitive for organizations like St. Paul. Through the generosity of Suburban Dental Medicine and S.C.A.R.F., St. Paul is now better equipped in the event of a cardiac emergency.


Middle School/Confirmation Winter Retreat

A Note from Vicar Nicholas

The Advent season is now upon us as we simultaneously anticipate the birth of Jesus Christ and await the Second Coming of Christ. This season offers us a time to linger in the waiting for things to unfold and be revealed, and there are freezing temperatures and less sunshine to boot. Unfortunately, this winter weather can lead to what is called "seasonal affective disorder," causing symptoms of fatigue, depression, hopelessness, and social withdrawal. Therapists and Psychologists can offer expert advice and guidance on how to address these symptoms. On our end, here at St. Paul, we acknowledge the myriad of life circumstances and challenges in our community member's lives, so we are offering grief support groups on Sundays in Room 3 from 11am-11:45am through the Advent season. It will culminate with an informal Longest Night service at 11am on 12/22.

As a faith community, we will continue to gather every Sunday sharing a sacred space together where all of your feelings, be they hopeless, anxious, grief-stricken, or filled with an eager joy and peace, are welcomed. Come as you are and worship the Lord!
