A Note From Vicar Nicholas



Sharing God's Abundance

Everybody expects their church to ask for money, but do you know your church gives it away, too? Well, lovely people of St. Paul, thanks to your generosity there is a sweet sum of money to be disbursed to worthy organizations this year.

In a recent reorganization of existing committees, the Benevolence, Mission Endowment and Memorial committees have aligned themselves into one new "Giving Committee," which resides under the umbrella of Stewardship. With this new committee, we hope St. Paul's outside donations will be more intentional and well-rounded, and that communication will improve between the committee, Finance Committee, Council and congregation.

Because of your generosity, there are four pockets of money from which the Giving Committee may allocate gifts. They are: budgeted benevolence gifts, ProJECT Forward tithe, rollover from 2024 surplus giving, and interest from the Mission Endowment Fund (Mission Endowment interest is designated at the end of the year, when the amount of accrued interest is known.) At their first meeting in early March, Giving Committee members were privileged to designate, and Council has approved:

From first quarter budgeted benevolence funds:

\$750 to Lutheran Outdoor Ministries Center (LOMC)

\$2.050 to Lutherdale

\$2000 to Missionary Sponsorship*

\$400 to Adult Christian Care*

From the ProJECT Forward tithe (an amount of \$675 per quarter):

\$175 to Reconciling Works \$500 to Holy Family Ministries

From the 2024 Budget Surplus:

\$1000 for roof project for new medical clinic in Tanzania

The Giving Committee will meet quarterly, and joyfully awaits sharing the abundance of God's blessings as received by St. Paul Lutheran Church.


