Once more we have navigated our way to the empty tomb as we move ahead through the season of Easter. The brass band, pastel outfits, beautiful flowers, and overflowing pews of Easter Sunday are now a memory of weeks passed, and yet the celebration continues all the way until Pentecost. Truthfully the joy of the resurrection cannot be contained within a single Sunday, or season for that matter, as we celebrate the resurrection every time we gather as God's beloved community to offer prayer, praise, and thanksgiving to the God of resurrected life. Truly embodying this resurrected lifestyle requires us to live the hope and promise of Easter every day of our life. I find this to be challenging at times as a Pastor who is exhausted by the time the Easter Sunday celebration is over, and cannot fathom such excitement without end. Yet, as I say this, I know that I draw on this resurrection promise not only in times of joy, but especially in moments of grief. As we face loss and death in our daily lives, whether it be a job, a relationship or a loved one, I find strength in the Easter promise, hope in the resurrection. If we contain the joy of Easter to a passing moment or season, we aren't necessarily "keeping it special", but are instead limiting what makes it so special-the unbridled joy and promise that regardless of the hardship we face in our daily life "Christ has risen, he has risen indeed!". A refrain and reminder that because Christ has lives anew. we do too.


Sunday School News


