I am excited for my Pastoral Renewal this summer as I seek to find renewed energy through travels with my family and in the company of friends. We all look to different activities, places, and space for renewal and I hope that this summer you too are able to find your Sabbath rest, wherever you may be.



This summer I will be taking part in year one of my two-year Pastoral Renewal program, made possible through a generous grant from the Lilly Foundation. The grant process was aided by the Mutual Ministry Committee, and together we created a theme "Pastoral Renewal: St. Paul's Best Idea" (a play on Ken Burns's documentary "The National Parks: America's Best Idea"). This renewal will be national park-themed and take place over the course of 6 weeks (June 20 - August 1). During this time our family will explore a variety of National Parks (including, but not limited to Yellowstone, Theodore Roosevelt, Olympic, and Denali), finding rest in natural spaces. Our trip will also take us to Alaska to spend time exploring the natural beauty of the 49th state while spending time with some beloved seminary colleagues. These travels are meant to provide intentional time for renewal in order that I/we may better serve together for years to come.

The fun is not limited to my travels, since portions of the grant allow for the congregation to experience renewal as well. Group activities, celebrations, a National Parks themed VBS, and the Congregational Campout at LOMC are just a few of these activities planned for this year. While I am gone, I have a team of pastors and leaders, some familiar and some new, who will be covering pastoral duties in my absence. Vicar Nicholas and I have planned together to ensure that all areas of ministry are covered during my leave, a time during which I will not be in direct contact with the congregation in order to ensure true rest. I am thankful for these leaders that are helping to support you during my renewal, and for the Mutual Ministry Committee and church leadership who have worked to make this all work logistically. Most of all, I am thankful for your support as a congregation, encouraging me to find ways to care for myself and my family, that I may better care for you in return. I look forward to sharing my adventures with you when I return later this summer!

- PRIDE is alive and well in parades, festivals, and special events across Chicagoland this summer. You

 recipients of our "All are Welcome" t-shirt fundraiser.
- St. Paul will send Pastor Zak off on his "Renewal of Vocation" (RV), Part 1 with a reception on June 15th after the 9am service. Join us in the Café for refreshments and remarks about his plans and our congregation's opportunities to connect to God's Creation.
- St. Paul has participated generously in collecting Welcome Packs for local refugee families through Exodus World Service. Meet Lyndsay Monsen St. Paul's 2025-2026 Pastoral Intern



Hello, St. Paul! My name is Lyndsay Monsen (she/her), and I look forward to joining you this upcoming year as Vicar starting August 17. I am a final-year Master of Divinity student at the Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago, preparing for ordination in Word and Sacrament Ministry. I also received a bachelor's in communication studies from Luther College in 2019. I grew up in Highland Park, IL but coincidentally have family in Villa Park and the surrounding areas, so I'm excited for this opportunity to spend more time in a community I've loved over the years. I'm particularly eager to dive into worship life and youth programming at St. Paul, and I look forward to getting to know the congregation through one-on-one conversations.

My ministry experience, prior to starting seminary, has mostly taken place outside the four walls of a church—on summer staff at Lutherdale Bible Camp in Wisconsin, serving with the ELCA's Young Adults in Global Mission program in Palestine, and working in faith-based advocacy in Washington, DC—so spending this upcoming year in a congregation full-time will be new for me. It will be great to finally take what I've learned these past three years at LSTC about pastoral care, ministerial leadership, and the Bible into a ministry setting.

Down the road, I would love to do some sort of outdoor ministry, having thru-hiked the Appalachian Trail (over 2,000 miles from Georgia to Maine) prior to starting seminary. When I'm not planning my next big hike, writing a sermon, or reading the stack of books I've accumulated the past couple years, you can probably find me swimming in Lake Michigan, cooking for friends, at a concert, or spending time with my sweet 4-year-old chocolate lab, Maggie.

A Note from Vicar Nicholas

On Sunday, May 11th my internship project culminated in an Interfaith Dinner and Fundraiser for DuPage PADS, a non-profit organization that provides resources and housing for people struggling with homelessness in our county. We hosted our interfaith partners from Congregation Etz Chaim in Lombard and the Islamic Foundation in Villa Park. Those present heard from speakers representing each faith community, Muslim, Jewish, and Christian speaking to our call in caring for and serving our most vulnerable neighbors. Together we raised a total of \$2,975 for DuPage PADS.



The deepest of gratitude to all who contributed monetary or food donations, offered prayers, those who attended the event, and the many volunteers and lay leaders who were the backbone of making it happen. Although we were only able to have a small cohort of St. Paul members attend, mostly church council members and members affiliated with PADS, there may be future opportunities for more interfaith engagement and volunteering at PADS. 
