To say that this past summer has been a blur would be an understatement. During my six-week time of renewal, I did not sleep in my bed for twenty-seven straight days, certainly a personal record. We visited six National Parks, including a trip to Denali in Alaska. After a brief rest (four nights) I was back on the road for the High School Youth Trip to Minnesota's Boundary Waters. A week of camping, canoeing, and government latrines was how my time away from daily life in the

church ended, and I wouldn't have had it any other way. Am I tired? Yes. Am I sore? Yes. Am I strangely renewed and invigorated for the work ahead? Absolutely.

Something that I took away from this past summer was the impact of Sabbath rest, not just for the body, but mind and spirit too. Driving 5,000+ miles wasn't exactly restful for my back, but all we took in along the way renewed my soul. Experiencing God in new places and experiences made me appreciate even more the familiar ways and places I see God in my daily life and routines.

I am so thankful for the experiences this process has allowed, but I am even more thankful to return to this community in which I experience God in our daily life together. God is not just here or there, but all of God is everywhere. This is my greatest joy, knowing that God is here at work in this community, which I cherish so deeply.


