In this moment where I feel overwhelmed, I cling to the hope that I am not alone in the chaos. That God is ever-present in these chaotic times, inviting us to strive for the order of justice, peace, and love at all times and in all circumstances.

# Special Guest Rev. Marcus Lohrman October 19 at 9am

Join us in the sanctuary October 19 during Education Hour as we welcome Rev. Marcus Lohrman who will share about his new book "*Ptoxocracy: An End to Christianity"* (see description below). Rev. Lohrmann is a public theologian, author, Pastor of Shepherd of the Valley Lutheran Church (La Mesa, CA), and seminary colleague of Pr. Zak. Rev. Lohrman will facilitate a discussion centered around his writings and share in conversation regarding the intersection of faith, politics, and economics in the modern church. Copies of his book will be available for purchase during this event.

"To have a meaningful stake in the lives of the poor, argues M. C. Lohrmann, would change the ways in which governance of all types—national or local municipalities, denominations, religious judicatories, and non-profit boards—determines its focus. Lohrmann defines ptoxocracy (derived from the Greek ptoxoi, the poorest of the poor) as "governance by the materially poor; a hybrid form of representative democracy whereby only persons of the lowest economic status are eligible for elected public office." This model, he contends, allows us to step back from the coupling of wealth and power created by myths of meritocracy and a rich ruling class to envision a system that works for the good of the whole."

There is a sadness that comes with packing up our summer fun. Today I will take down and scrub out the hummingbird feeders hanging near my house. The hummingbirds, now headed south, haven't visited in a while, and I miss the show. Their aerial acrobatics are amazing. For the price of some sugar, we've had months of summer entertainment. Interestingly hummingbirds are exceedingly territorial. When one bird is at the feeder, it aggressively fends off all others. It will chase them down while chattering and scolding them for getting too close. There might be 3 or 4 birds, zooming this way and that, all vying for a sip of nectar. The human in charge of the feeder (me) is very amused by this. Each feeder has 4 or 5 ports for drinking; there are several cups of nectar within. This particular human will make more nectar as soon as the supply gets low. There is plenty for everyone. And yet, very rarely are more than one hummingbird feeding at a time. They don't seem to want to share.

I think people aren't so different from hummingbirds. We get pretty protective of our 'stuff.' We tend to forget that God has and will continue to provide everything we need. And there definitely is enough to go around. This fall, as we discuss our support of St. Paul Church during our stewardship campaign "A Future With Hope," we'll consider God's great abundance - that daily we are blessed with the love of family and friends, a vibrant and caring church community, a beautiful world in which to live and so much more. Our stewardship campaign will begin on Sunday, October 19th with our ingathering on Sunday, November 9th.
