

Always Getting Ready, Never Ready Pastor Zak

The season of Advent is a time of getting ready. The church spends four weeks preparing to enter into the Mystery of Incarnation. As a community we are going to spend the coming

weeks preparing to welcome the Christ-child in the world once more. Preparing to welcome a child into the world is one of the wildest experiences of my life (especially with the two-for-one deal God blessed us with the second time around). I remember browsing the baby books, collecting the clothes, and renovating the room feeling like we had checked all of the boxes to be adequately prepared for our baby's arrival. Boy were we wrong! The truth is nothing truly can prepare parent(s) for the arrival of a child, especially when the child decides to arrive nearly two months early. All the time in the world could not have prepared us to become parents, it was something we simply had to experience.

In many ways the experience of the Christ-child's arrival feels oddly familiar in that I'm always getting ready, but never truly ready. Truth be told, I am never really ready for Christmas, which somehow seems to arrive earlier and earlier every year. I am overwhelmed by my responsibilities as parent and pastor. Yet, in the midst of the chaos that is the arrival of a child. I find such a sense of hope, peace, joy, and love. Perhaps that is why long ago the candles we light to prepare the way were assigned these meaningful words. A reminder that we are never truly ready for Christ to enter our lives, and yet every day we experience Christ active in our lives. The true gift of Christmas is the reminder that God is here, now, and always—whether or not we're ready. It is perfectly normal to feel as though we're not ready for the busyness ahead, which is why it's important to be reminded it's not about us, but God. The same God who encourages the Psalmist to "be still and know that I am God," which is excellent advice for someone like myself who acts like it is my preparedness that prepares the way of the Lord. The only thing we can truly do to prepare for the Lord is to open our hearts to His love this day, and every day.

A Letter from Vicar Lyndsay

"We're gonna keep on moving forward, we're gonna keep on moving forward, we're gonna keep on moving forward, never turning back, never turning back." These were the words I sang on Friday, November 14, outside the Broadview ICE facility alongside clergy colleagues of many faiths as we attempted to bring communion to those detained inside the facility. And as the police arrested and dragged many faith leaders away, one by one, our refrains turned to, "we're gonna keep on singing loudly," "we're gonna keep on loving boldly," and "we're gonna work for change together."

It was a morning that I will not soon—if ever—forget. It was a morning that reminded me that God demands freedom and that God does not bless cages. And it was a morning that reignited my heart's passion for the intersection of faith and justice, which I am eager to share here at St. Paul in a few upcoming ways:

First, on Sunday, December 7 at the 9 am hour, I will be sharing about my time in Palestine serving with the ELCA's Young Adults in Global Mission program from 2019-2020. This will be an informational time to learn more about our Palestinian Lutheran siblings in the Holy Land as well as what life is like under illegal occupation. I hope you will come with a curious mind!

Then, as we turn to the new year, I am excited to share my internship project, which will be a months-long prison ministry campaign. The programming will begin on Sunday, January 11, when a staff member from Kolbe House Jail Ministry (of the Catholic Archdiocese of Chicago) will offer a training on how to be a pen pal with someone in jail or prison across the state of Illinois. Given the nature of these pen pal relationships, this is only for those 18+, but there will be an opportunity for kids (as well as any adults that might not have space for a sustained pen pal relationship) to write one-time cards ahead of Easter. The project (but not the work!) will then conclude on Sunday, March 29 at an ecumenical Palm Sunday Prayer Walk around Cook County Jail.

More information will be coming as each of those dates gets closer, but in the meantime if you have any questions at all about this project or more largely why I believe this work of justice is an imperative of our Christian faith, do not hesitate to send me an email or find me on a Sunday morning!




