

Debunking Dyslexia Myths

Dear Bethany Families,

I hope this letter finds you well. This month, we're focusing on an important topic that affects many of our students: Dyslexia. There are many misconceptions about this learning difference, so I'd like to share some key information to help us all better understand and support our dyslexic learners.

10 Common Myths About Dyslexia - Debunked!

1. Myth: Dyslexia is identified by an intelligence test.

Fact: Dyslexia can affect people of all intelligence levels.

2. Myth: People with dyslexia can't read at all.

Fact: Those with dyslexia can learn to read and spell, but may struggle to reflect their true abilities.

3. Myth: All dyslexics read and write backwards.

Fact: Mirror writing is rare, but confusing similar-looking letters is common.

4. Myth: If a test report doesn't use the word "dyslexia," you don't have it.

Fact: Dyslexia is a broad term, and reports may use various words to describe specific challenges.

5. Myth: Dyslexia is caused by bad teaching.

Fact: Studies show dyslexia is hereditary and neurological.

6. Myth: There's no evidence that dyslexia exists.

Fact: Extensive research proves dyslexia is a real physiological condition.

7. Myth: A child with dyslexia will catch up later.

Fact: Early intervention is crucial to prevent widening gaps in learning.

8. Myth: Vision therapy and colored lenses cure dyslexia.

Fact: Dyslexia is language-based, not vision-based.

9. Myth: Dyslexia can't be identified until age eight.

Fact: Signs can appear as early as when a child starts school, and screening can begin at age five and a half.

10. Myth: Children who struggle to read are just lazy.

Fact: Dyslexia is a hidden disability that makes reading and spelling very challenging.

Understanding these myths helps us better support our students with dyslexia. We're committed to early identification, appropriate interventions, and creating an inclusive environment where all students can thrive.
