

WELCOME

CALL TO WORSHIP:

- L: Saints, see the cloud of witnesses surround us;
- **P**: Their lives of faith encourage and astound us.
- **L**: Hear how the Master praised their faith so fervent:
- P: Well done, My servant!
- L: Jesus, You, You alone, deserve all glory! Our lives unfold, embraced within Your Story;
- P: Past, present, future—You, the same forever—
- All: You fail us never!

CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS:

- L: Holy God, in baptism You make sinners to be saints and declare those guilty before the law to be holy before You.
- P: Yet Holy Lord we, Your redeemed people, sealed with Your Spirit, given a new identity as the holy children of God through Your only Son, confess that we have not constantly lived a holy life
- L: and that we are by nature a fallen and broken people who have sinned against You, O Holy Lord.
- I Like saints gone before us who now rest from their labors and gather around Your throne, we too come for refuge to Your infinite mercy and grace, for we have sinned against You O Lord. We have not loved You with our whole heart nor have we loved our neighbors as ourselves. Yet, in love, You have given Your only Son to die for us. Now for His sake, forgive us all our sin. By Your Spirit, increase in us true knowledge of You and Your will and true obedience to Your word, that by Your grace we may come to everlasting life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen
- I: Rejoice! For the sake of Jesus Christ you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people who belong to God! For He, who has called you out of darkness into His marvelous light, has called me here to declare that your sins are forgiven in His name, the name of the Father, + + and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

- L: Almighty God, You have knit Your people together in the mystical body of Your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord,
- P: Give to Your church on earth Your light and Your peace; and grant us Your Spirit that we might follow Your blessed saints who rest from their labors as we too live lives of faithfulness and joyful service, until with them we receive the crown of life and also hear those words,
- **L**: "Well done, good and faithful servant." Amen.

OLD TESTAMENT READING: Revelations 7:9-17

After these things I saw a large crowd from every nation, tribe, people, and language. No one was able to count how many people there were. They were standing in front of the throne and the lamb. They were wearing white robes, holding palm branches in their hands, and crying out in a loud voice, "Salvation belongs to our God, who sits on the throne, and to the lamb!"

All the angels stood around the throne with the leaders and the four living creatures. They bowed in front of the throne with their faces touching the ground, worshiped God, and said,

"Amen! Praise, glory, wisdom, thanks, honor, power, and strength be to our God forever and ever! Amen!"

One of the leaders asked me, "Who are these people wearing white robes, and where did they come from?"

I answered him, "Sir, you know." Then he told me,

"These are the people who are coming out of the terrible suffering.

They have washed their robes

and made them white in the blood of the lamb.

When Jesus saw the crowds, He went up a mountain and sat down. His disciples came to Him, and He began to teach them:



CONFESSION OF FAITH: THE APOSTLES' CREED

C: I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth.

And in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty. From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life + everlasting. Amen.

- **L**: These and all other things that are heavy on our hearts and minds we bind together in the prayer that Jesus has taught us to pray....

Our Father, Who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name, Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. 
To prepare for communion you can find prayer prompts on the front page of the burgundy hymnal. Or simply pray: "Dear Lord Jesus, at Your gracious invitation, You invite me to come to You; to eat and drink Your holy body and blood as You Yourself have promised to give in this sacred meal. Forgive me of my sin, through this Your meal of Forgiveness. Let me experience the fullness of Your love, through this Your meal of love. Strengthen my faith, through this meal of Yours that calls for and bestows faith. Empower me to live for You, through this Your meal that promises life everlasting and equips me for daily living as one who has received You and Your gifts. Amen."

THE WORDS INSTITUTION

For those communing, who so desire, the center cups in each tray are <u>alcohol free</u>. The wafers on the stand next to the pillar pulpit side (when kneeling for communion) or on the stand in front of the baptismal font (when processing for communion) are <u>gluten free</u>.

In our 9:30 a.m. service we will practice the Easter tradition of continuous communion. We will not kneel at the altar, rather we will join the procession of saints and come forward and remain standing as we receive the bread and wine. After receiving the elements, you are invited to return to your seat and continue in meditation, prayer and song.


