
ASH WEDNESDAY March 5, 2025 6:30 pm Worship



CALL TO WORSHIP:

- "When our Lord and Master Jesus Christ said, 'Repent'.
 He willed the entire life of believers be one of repentance." *
- P: Repentance consists of contrition, which is both terror and sorrow over our sin;
- L: and absolution, which is believing that for the sake of Christ, God Himself, forgives our sins. Therefore, in this Lenten Season let us be honest about ourselves, confess our sin and receive God's promise of mercy and grace in Jesus.
- P: "Lord, to You I make confession:
 I have sinned and gone astray,
 I have multiplied transgressions,
 chosen for myself my way.
 Led by You to see my errors,
 Lord, I tremble at Your terrors." **
- L: "Lord, on You we cast our burden, sink them in the deepest sea! Let us know Your gracious pardon, cleanse us from iniquity. Let Your Spirit leave us never; make us only Yours forever!" **
- P: "For Your Son has suffered for me, given Himself to rescue me, died to save me and restore me, reconciled and set me free." **
- "Jesus' cross alone has vanquished all dark fears and soothed all anguish." **
 In His name and for His sake, I forgive you all your sins.
 Go cleansed, restored and renewed to follow and serve Him.

IMPOSITION OF ASHES: Follow ushers' directions to the imposition stations.

(From ancient times God's people have worn ash as a sign of repentance. The custom developed in the early church that when people who had left the fold, desired to return to the flock and commune at Easter they wore an ashen cross throughout the Lenten Season. In this service we receive an ashen cross as a sign of our repentance and a testimony of our desire to be united to Christ and His body the Church. You may choose to receive the ashes on your forehead or the back of your hand. Please indicate your preference by holding out the back side of your hand or holding back your hair. Should you choose to not come up for the imposition of ashes you may remain quietly in your seat for personal confession, meditation and singing.)

Verse 1



OLD TESTAMENT RESPONSIVE READING: (Based on Joel 2)

- L: Return to the LORD your God. Even now, declares the LORD, return to me with all your heart, with fasting and weeping and mourning.
- P: Return to the LORD your God.

NEW TESTAMENT READING: 2 Corinthians 5:20b – 6:10

We beg you on behalf of Christ to become reunited with God. God had Christ, who was sinless, take our sin so that we might receive God's approval through him.

Since we are God's coworkers, we urge you not to let God's kindness be wasted on you. God says,

"At the right time I heard you.

On the day of salvation I helped you."

Listen, now is God's acceptable time! Now is the day of salvation!

We don't give people any opportunity to find fault with how we serve. Instead, our lives demonstrate that we are God's servants. We have endured many things: suffering, distress, anxiety, beatings, imprisonments, riots, hard work, sleepless nights, and lack of food. People can see our purity, knowledge, patience, kindness, the Holy Spirit's presence in our lives, our sincere love, truthfulness, and the presence of God's power. We demonstrate that we are God's servants as we are praised and dishonored, as we are slandered and honored, and as we use what is right to attack what is wrong and to defend the truth. We are treated as dishonest although we are honest, as unknown although we are well-known, as dying although, as you see, we go on living. We are punished, but we are not killed. People think we are sad although we're always glad, that we're beggars although we make many people spiritually rich, that we have nothing although we possess everything.

HOLY GOSPEL: *Matthew 6:1-6 & 16-21*



"When you fast, stop looking sad like hypocrites. They put on sad faces to make it obvious that they're fasting. I can guarantee this truth: That will be their only reward. When you fast, wash your face and comb your hair. Then your fasting won't be

obvious. Instead, it will be obvious to your Father who is with you in private. Your Father sees what you do in private. He will reward you.

"Stop storing up treasures for yourselves on earth, where moths and rust destroy and thieves break in and steal. Instead, store up treasures for yourselves in heaven, where moths and rust don't destroy and thieves don't break in and steal. Your heart will be where your treasure is.

but deliver us from evil.


For Thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.
