

THE ACCOUNT OF PALM SUNDAY: Luke 19:29-44

When He came near Bethphage and Bethany at the Mount of Olives (as it was called), Jesus sent two of His disciples ahead of Him. He said to them, "Go into the village ahead of you. As you enter, you will find a young donkey tied there. No one has ever sat on it. Untie it, and bring it. If anyone asks you why you are untying it, say that the Lord needs it."

The men Jesus sent found it as He had told them. While they were untying the young donkey, its owners asked them, "Why are you untying the donkey?"

The disciples answered, "The Lord needs it."

They brought the donkey to Jesus, put their coats on it, and helped Jesus onto it. As He was riding along, people spread their coats on the road. By this time He was coming near the place where the road went down the Mount of Olives. Then the whole crowd of disciples began to praise God for all the miracles they had seen. They should joyfully,

"Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven, and glory in the highest heaven."

Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to Jesus, "Teacher, tell Your disciples to be quiet."

Jesus replied, "I can guarantee that if they are quiet, the stones will cry out."

When He came closer and saw the city, He began to cry. He said, "If you had only known today what would bring you peace! But now it is hidden, so you cannot see it. The time will come when enemy armies will build a wall to surround you and close you in on every side. They will level you to the ground and kill your people. One stone will not be left on top of another, because you didn't recognize the time when God came to help you." – GW ®

CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS:

- L: Dear Lord, many times we have known what You have needed from us, yet we were unwilling to give.
- P: We have often questioned You, Lord, "What are You doing?"
 "Why are You taking?"
 "Why have You not?"
 "Why have You allowed?"
 "Why, Lord, why?"

- L: Like the crowd in Jerusalem, we too rejoice at Your arrival.
- Yet, we must confess, that at times we live as if You were never to arrive. In our attitudes and our actions, in our desires and our deeds we have lived as if You were far off, uninvolved and unconcerned with us and Your children's behavior.
- **L**: Yet our unworthiness goes much deeper.
- We are by nature fallen, unholy and self-absorbed.
 Often finding ourselves using You to justify our will and our wants.
 We admit Lord that we deserve to have You come to us in judgment.
- **L**: For the Glory of Your name and the sake of Your love enter our lives today Lord, triumphant and victorious, forgiving and merciful.
- **P**: Bestow on us the blessing of Your work and save us Lord.
- L: Hosanna, the Lord saves and He has saved you! The Lord comes here today in these words to cheer you, "For Jesus' sake your sin is forgiven."
- P: Hosanna! Hosanna in the Highest!
- **L**: Blessed be the name of the Lord.
- P: Amen.

FIRST SCRIPTURE READING: Isaiah 52:13-53:4

My servant will be successful. He will be respected, praised, and highly honored. Many will be shocked by Him. His appearance will be so disfigured that He won't look like any other man. His looks will be so disfigured that He will hardly look like a human. He will cleanse many nations with His blood. Kings will shut their mouths because of Him. They will see things that they had never been told. They will understand things that they had never heard. Who has believed our message? To whom has the Lord's power been revealed? He grew up in His presence like a young tree, like a root out of dry ground. He had no form or majesty that would make us look at Him. He had nothing in His appearance that would make us desire Him. He was despised and rejected by people. He was a man of sorrows, familiar with suffering. He was despised like one from whom people turn their faces, and we didn't consider Him to be worth anything. He certainly has taken upon Himself our suffering and carried our sorrows, but we thought that God had wounded Him, beat Him, and punished Him. – GW®

The Lord's Supper is celebrated at Bethany in the joyful confession that our Lord gives us His very Body and Blood for the forgiveness of sins in this sacrament. God intends this gift for His children who recognize their sin, trust in Christ as their Savior, desire to live for Him alone and join in this joyful confession.

To help you prepare for communion we invite you to take a few moments of quiet prayer. For aid there are prayers on the front page of the hymnal for both before and after the reception of communion. Or simply pray, *Dear Lord Jesus, at Your gracious invitation You invite me to come* to You, to eat and drink Your holy body and blood as You Yourself have promised to give in this sacrament of Your altar. Forgive me of my sin, through this Your meal of Forgiveness. Let me experience the fullness of Your love, through this Your meal of love. Strengthen my faith, through this meal of Yours that calls for and bestows faith. Empower me to live for You, through this Your meal that promises life everlasting and equips me for daily living as one who has received You and Your gifts.

WORDS OF INSTITUTION

For those communing, who so desire, the center cups in each tray are <u>alcohol free.</u> The wafers on the stand next to the pillar pulpit side (when kneeling for communion) or on the stand in front of the baptismal font (when processing for communion) are <u>gluten free</u>.

In our 9:30 service, we will practice the Easter tradition of continuous communion. We will not kneel at the altar, rather we will join the procession of saints and come forward and remain standing as we receive the bread and wine. After receiving the elements, you are invited to return to your seat and continue in meditation, prayer and song.
