


"TAKE THIS, AND SHARE IT... THIS IS MY BODY, THIS IS MY BLOOD." LUKE 22

NEW TESTAMENT READING: 1 Corinthians 11:23-29

After all, I passed on to you what I had received from the Lord.

On the night He was betrayed, the Lord Jesus took bread and spoke a prayer of thanksgiving. He broke the bread and said, "This is My body, which is given for you. Do this to remember Me." When supper was over, He did the same with the cup. He said, "This cup is the new promise made with My blood. Every time you drink from it, do it to remember Me." Every time you eat this bread and drink from this cup, you tell about the Lord's death until He comes.

Therefore, whoever eats the bread or drinks from the Lord's cup in an improper way will be held responsible for the Lord's body and blood. With this in mind, individuals must determine whether what they are doing is proper when they eat the bread and drink from the cup. Anyone who eats and drinks is eating and drinking a judgment against himself when he doesn't recognize the Lord's body.–GW \circledast

When Jesus came to Simon Peter, Peter asked Him, "Lord, are You going to wash my feet?"


Jesus answered Peter, "You don't know now what I'm doing. You will understand later."

+ Service of the Sacrament +

The Lord's Supper is celebrated at Bethany in the joyful confession that our Lord gives us His very Body and Blood for the forgiveness of sins in this sacrament. God intends this gift for His children who recognize their sin, trust in Christ as their Savior, desire to live for Him alone and join in this joyful confession.

To help you prepare for communion we invite you to take a few moments of quiet prayer. For aid there are prayers on the front page of the hymnal for both before and after the reception of communion. Or simply pray, *Dear Lord Jesus, at Your gracious invitation You invite me to come to You, to eat and drink Your holy body and blood as You Yourself have promised to give in this sacrament of Your altar. Forgive me of my sin, through this Your meal of Forgiveness. Let me experience the fullness of Your love, through this Your meal of love. Strengthen my faith, through this meal of Yours that calls for and bestows faith. Empower me to live for You, through this Your meal that promises life everlasting and equips me for daily living as one who has received You and Your gifts.*

For those communing, who so desire, center cups in each tray are <u>alcohol free.</u> The wafers next to the Christ candle are <u>gluten free;</u> for those with dietary restrictions, please take a gluten free wafer.

Tonight, we will kneel around the altar; our choir will commune last. Please follow the guidance of our ushers, come forward, and remain standing until our Pastor welcomes you to kneel and receive the bread and wine. After receiving the elements, you are invited to return to your seat and continue in meditation, prayer and song.

CALL TO THE TABLE:

- **L**: Our God has invited us to His table this evening.
- P: And we are worthy and well prepared who trust in these words: "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins."
- **L**: Our God promises to feed us with the Bread of Life.
- **P**: And we are worthy and well prepared who trust in these words: "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins."
- L: Our God will lead us from this meal changed, desiring to live for Him alone, Father, → Son and Holy Spirit. Amen.
- P: And we are worthy and well prepared who trust in these words: "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins."

CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS:

L: Jesus' love has brought us here tonight. His love for us is what this night is all about. It was on this evening that He said to His disciples, "A new command I give to you: Love one another as I have loved you." Yet, we have failed to keep this command, and so we confess our lack of love and seek His forgiveness.

 Dear Lord, You demand all of my love, not just part of it. In humility I confess that I have not loved my neighbors, my family, nor You, my God, as You have called me to, let alone as I love myself.
My love is so often self-serving and shallow.
I do not deserve to be loved by You.
For Your sake, O Christ, forgive me all my sins and enable me to love You with all my heart, soul, mind and strength. Amen.

- **L**: The love of God knows no bounds. In love, He came in Christ to die for us. In love, He forgives us our lack of love. In love, He invites us to His table where we might experience His love and learn to share it.
- P: Amen.

WORDS OF INSTITUTION: Matthew 26:26-28




