failed to share Your love as we ought, let alone as You have


commanded us to do; for the sake of Jesus Christ forgive us our sins, restore us to Yourself, kindle in us the flame of Your Spirit and move us to proclaim Your goodness and graciousness in the Crucified, Risen

and Ascended Lord. Amen.

Leader: Through the power of the Spirit, God has made you alive in Christ, when you

were dead in your transgressions. As a called servant of Christ and by His authority I forgive you all your sins, in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. Now that same God fill this room as He filled that room on the first Pentecost with His Spirit of power and transform us, the body of

Christ here, to reflect and share the love of Jesus. Amen.



THE ACCOUNT OF THE FIRST PENTECOST:

When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them.

Now there were staying in Jerusalem God-fearing Jews from every nation under heaven. When they heard this sound, a crowd came together in bewilderment, because each one heard them speaking in his own language. Utterly amazed, they asked: "Are not all these men who are speaking Galileans? Then how is it that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya near Cyrene; visitors from Rome (both Jews and converts to Judaism); Cretans and Arabs—we hear them declaring the wonders of God in our own tongues!" Amazed and perplexed, they asked one another, "What does this mean?"

Some, however, made fun of them and said, "They have had too much wine."

Then Peter stood up with the Eleven, raised his voice and addressed the crowd: "Fellow Jews and all of you who live in Jerusalem, let me explain this to you; listen carefully to what I say. These men are not drunk, as you suppose. It's only nine in the morning! No, this is what was spoken by the prophet Joel:

"In the last days, God says, I will pour out my Spirit on all people.

Your sons and daughters will prophesy, your young men will see visions, your old men will dream dreams. Even on my servants, both men and women, *I will pour out my Spirit in those days, and they will prophesy.*

I will show wonders in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood and fire and billows of smoke. The sun will be turned to darkness and the moon to blood before the coming of the great and glorious day of the Lord.

And everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.'

CONFESSION OF FAITH: Third Article of the Apostles' Creed & Meaning according

to Luther's Small Catechism

ALL: I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church,

the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins,

the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

Leader: What does this mean?

ALL: I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength

believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel,

enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith.

In the same way He calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies the whole Christian Church on earth, and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one true faith.

In this Christian Church He daily and richly forgives all my sins

and the sins of all believers.

On the Last Day he will raise me and all the dead, and give eternal life to me and all believers in Christ.

This is most certainly true.

HOLY GOSPEL: John 14:23-31

Jesus answered him, "Those who love Me will do what I say. My Father will love them, and we will go to them and make our home with them. A person who doesn't love Me doesn't do what I say. I don't make up what you hear Me say. What I say comes from the Father who sent Me.

"I have told you this while I'm still with you. However, the helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My name, will teach you everything. He will remind you of everything that I have ever told you.

"I'm leaving you peace. I'm giving you my peace. I don't give you the kind of peace that the world gives. So don't be troubled or cowardly. 
WORDS OF INSTITUTION


For those communing, who so desire, center cups in each tray are <u>alcohol free</u>.
