WELCOME



CALL TO WORSHIP: (based on Col. 1:3)

- In the name of the Father and of the

 → Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.
- P: We always thank God; the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ through the Spirit He has given us.

CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS: (based on Col. 1:21 ff)


L: Once we were separated from God. The sinful things we did, the holy things we left undone, showed us for the people which we are by nature. But Christ has brought us back to God by dying in His body on the cross. He did this so that we could come into God's presence without sin, fault or blame.

- P: Almighty God, have mercy upon us, forgive us our sins, and lead us to everlasting life. Amen.
- L: God has made you alive with Christ. He forgives all your failures. He did this by erasing the charges that were brought against you. He took the charges away by nailing them to the cross of Jesus. In His name and by His authority, I forgive you all your sins. Amen.

FIRST READING: Colossians 3:1-11

Since you were brought back to life with Christ, focus on the things that are above—where Christ holds the honored position—the one next to God the Father on the heavenly throne. Keep your mind on things above, not on worldly things. You have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. Christ is your life. When He appears, then you, too, will appear with Him in glory.

Therefore, put to death whatever is worldly in you: your sexual sin, perversion, passion, lust, and greed (which is the same thing as worshiping wealth). It is because of these sins that God's anger comes on those who refuse to obey Him. You used to live that kind of sinful life. Also get rid of your anger, hot tempers, hatred, cursing, obscene language, and all similar sins. Don't lie to each other. You've gotten rid of the person you used to be and the life you used to live, and you've become a new person. This new person is continually renewed in knowledge to be like its Creator. Where this happens, there is no Greek or Jew, circumcised or uncircumcised, barbarian, uncivilized person, slave, or free person. Instead, Christ is everything and in everything. -GW®

HOLY GOSPEL: Luke 12:13-21


Someone in the crowd said to Him, "Teacher, tell my brother to give me my share of the inheritance that our father left us."

Jesus said to him, "Who appointed Me to be your judge or to divide your inheritance?"

He told the people, "Be careful to guard yourselves from every kind of greed. Life is not about having a lot of material possessions."

Then He used this illustration. He said, "A rich man had land that produced good crops. He thought, 'What should I do? I don't have enough room to store my crops.' He said, 'I know what I'll do. I'll tear down my barns and build bigger ones so that I can store all my grain and goods in them. Then I'll say to myself, "You've stored up a lot of good things for years to come. Take life easy, eat, drink, and enjoy yourself." '

CONFESSION OF FAITH: (based on Col. 1:15)

L: Jesus is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation. He created all things in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible. He is the head of the church which is his body and with the church on earth and in heaven we confess the faith once and for all delivered to the saints:

THE APOSTLES' CREED (*catholic means the universal Christian Church)

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, creator of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit, and born of the virgin Mary, He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell. On the third day He rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life

→ everlasting. Amen.

The Lord's Supper is celebrated at Bethany in the joyful confession that our Lord gives us His very Body and Blood for the forgiveness of sins in this sacrament. God intends this gift for His children who recognize their sin, trust in Christ as their Savior, desire to live for Him alone and join in this joyful confession.

To help you prepare for communion we invite you to take a few moments of quiet prayer. For aid there are prayers on the front page of the hymnal for both before and after the reception of communion. Or simply pray, Dear Lord Jesus, at Your gracious invitation You invite me to come to You, to eat and drink Your holy body and blood as You Yourself have promised to give in this sacrament of Your altar. Forgive me of my sin, through this Your meal of Forgiveness. Let me experience the fullness of Your love, through this Your meal of love. Strengthen my faith, through this meal of Yours that calls for and bestows faith. Empower me to live for You, through this Your meal that promises life everlasting and equips me for daily living as one who has received You and Your gifts.

WORDS OF INSTITUTION

For those communing, who so desire, the center cups in each tray are <u>alcohol free</u>.

The wafers on the stand next to the pillar pulpit side (when kneeling for communion) or on the stand in front of the baptismal font (when processing for communion) are <u>gluten free</u>.

In our 9:30 & 11:00 am services, we will practice the Easter tradition of continuous communion. We will not kneel at the altar, rather we will join the procession of saints and come forward and remain standing as we receive the bread and wine. After receiving the elements, you are invited to return to your seat and continue in meditation, prayer and song.

Verse 4


No guilt in life no fear in death
