# FROM THE PRINCIPAL

October 31 is Halloween, but it's also Reformation Day, the day we remember and honor Martin Luther, an important man in the history of the church (and the Lutheran church in particular!) Martin Luther was an amazing preacher, writer and hymn writer, but he was also a *teacher*, and believed in the importance of education. \*For example:

- In his writings, he designed an education system that starts with basic schools and continues to universities.
- He showed why schools are important for both the Church and the government and highlighted how valuable teachers are.
- He set the goal of education as helping people become well-rounded Christians, prepared for all parts of life.
- He reminded parents, pastors, and government leaders that they are responsible for educating children.
- He helped improve schools by creating grade levels, better subjects to study, and more effective teaching methods.
- By valuing nature and childhood, he helped shape the beginnings of educational science.
- He made teaching better by matching lessons to a child's ability, making learning enjoyable, encouraging curiosity through questions, focusing on real things not just words—and using discipline with kindness.
- He supported laws requiring all children to go to school.

Bethany Lutheran School is an echo of all that Martin Luther held dear as a teacher!
