
FROM YOUR SENIOR PASTOR



COLD-CALLING OR RELATIONSHIP BUILDING

I was driving recently when a political pundit came on the radio talking about the effectiveness of door-to-door vacuum cleaner salespeople versus the effectiveness of having a relationship with people. The speaker pointed out the historically poor success rate of door-to-door sales versus the documented success rate of sales through relationships. The pundit noted that Encyclopedia salespeople had experienced the same "no-thank you" and doors being closed in their faces that the vacuum salespeople did. As we know, both of those products via those sales methods are pretty much extinct.

The radio commentary caused me to reflect on my experiences as a financial advisor compared with my experiences in law enforcement. Law enforcement is a person-to-person profession. Patrol officers, detectives and supervisors meet with strangers every day, be they victims, suspects, or people just needing help through a variety of situations. As a patrol officer I interacted with people in the community every day and was always amazed at what they shared with me when just I let them talk.

When I went to work for a brokerage firm I marketed to the people I already had a relationship with, namely police and emergency personnel. After my first year I received an award for the clients and funds I had brought into the firm. My reward was an all-expense paid trip to New York for a week of training. One of the training topics was "cold-calling." In retrospect it was the equivalent of door-to-door sales using a phone. The training for cold-calling lasted almost an entire day. I listened as the trainers extolled the techniques, words and phrases we should use to convince the person on the phone to meet with us so we could continue the conversation about their money. In law enforcement I looked for patterns and trends to help solve crime so I asked the instructor "What's the success rate of cold-calling?

The reply, "If you can get two percent of the people to let you call them back, you're a success."

To make sure I'd heard the instructor correctly, I said, "So, you're spending almost an entire day of training us on a method where we'll maybe succeed two percent of the time?" The room was dead quiet. In those silent seconds I thought, We should be talking about face-to-face networking and building relationships, not cold-calling.

A year later my boss told me he wanted to see me sitting in my chair cold-calling for three-and-a-half hours a day. When I asked him why, he said, "Because I

don't understand what you do and cold-calling worked for me. Not a good enough reason for me to stay and not long after that I resigned.

I share that anecdote to make this point. Are we 'cold-calling' the people we meet or are we networking with people we meet to build relationships? Are we thinking about the people we routinely interact with as possibly needing Christ in their lives? Are we listening to our neighbors, our friends, or the local cashier where we buy our daily coffee for the clues they share about what's going on in their lives? Can we, or better yet, do we try to align what we're hearing from them with some of our life experiences so we can legitimately say, "I know that feeling, I've experienced that myself." Building a relationship with a person almost always involves having something in common with the person and if we can find what we have in common we're off to a good start.

Our Stephen Ministers are taught active focused listening skills. Law enforcement taught me that attentive listening opens doors to deeper conversations. Maybe the person you're listening to has Jesus Christ in their life and they just need to talk about something with someone. Great, and maybe God puts us in those situations just to be the compassionate listener in that moment. Then again, maybe that person doesn't have Christ in their life. When we listen first, we don't sound like a cold caller pushing a product. Listening first creates the opportunity for a myriad of conversations later including conversations about God and faith when the opportunity presents itself. When done through a relationship and at the right time those conversations can change lives. And they'll never feel like a cold-call.

SALUTE TO THE ARMED FORCES

On Veterans Day Sunday the congregation sang the closing hymn by that title. But I think many do not know in the Marine Corps hymn the meaning of the first stanza: "From the Halls of Montezuma to the Shores of Tripoli"

"The Halls of Montezuma" refers to the Battle of Chapultepec (1847) during the Mexican-American War.

"The Shores of Tripoli refers to the Barbary War (1801-1815). President Jefferson sent a naval and military force to battle the Barbary pirates that were attacking American shipping. After the Battle of Deren in 1805, where the marines hoisted the American flag over the Old World for the first time, the phrase was added to the battle colors of the Corps.

The Navy Hymn, "Anchors Away" has the line, "Farewell to college joys." This refers to Naval Academy graduates moving on to their duty assignments.

The Coast Guard Hymn includes the moto "Semper Paratus" which translates as Always Ready.
