
# Beware of Wrong Impressions



Back when David Jorstad was senior Pastor at Clairemont I told him a story I had heard. David liked the story and one Sunday morning he interrupted his sermon and asked me to stand up and tell it to the congregation.

The story went something like this:
One Sunday morning the Pastor of a small church dressed himself in ragged clothes, wrapped up in a blanket and laid in a pew. When parishioners arrived they saw who they thought was a homeless person who had somehow gotten into the Church overnight. When the ushers tried to evict him he revealed himself to the congregation and proceeded to conduct the service. His point, of course, was to teach his congregation the danger of jumping to wrong conclusions based on a person's appearance.

Even Jesus was subject to such a "wrong



impression." We read in the Gospel of John, 143" The next day Jesus decided to go to Galilee. He found Philip and said to him, "Follow me."44 Now Philip was from Bethsaida, the city of Andrew and Peter. 45 Philip found Nathanael and said to him, "We have found him about whom Moses in the Law and also the Prophets wrote, Jesus son of Joseph from Nazareth." 46 Nathanael said to him, "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?"

These stories are timely as we to are often faced with a similar dilemma. We drive down the street and see a person at a traffic light asking for change. We leave a restaurant with a "To Go" box and see someone who is obviously hungry. Someone enters our church dressed in shabby clothes, pours a cup

#### SERVING THOSE IN NEED

Part of being a community church is realizing that folks around us tend to see us a center of help and hope, even if they

are not officially a part of us.

One of the ways that plays out, is that when folks are in need of basic necessities (food, gas, diapers, housing, etc) without any



resources, they often approach one of our pastors for assistance. While we can't provide long term services, we an often help them bridge the need while helping them connect with other support. In order to do be able to help folks who come to us, we have a "pastors' discretionary fund". This allows our pastors to provide, confidentally, a meal or two, a tank of gas, a motel for the night... well, you get the idea. We are working on

developing practice and policy on how to do this in the safest and most effective way.

And that's where you come in. This fund is supported by your gifts, that come directly to the church earmarked for the pastors' discretionary fund, (NOT the individual pastors). It will be available for our pastors to use to provide the short term support described. And the more gifts we receive, the more help we can provide.

If you'd like to help, simply send your gift to the church office, clearly marked, Pastors' Discretionary Fund, and that gift will go directly to the fund.

God often uses the lowly and unexpected to share His majesty with the world:

- the baby Moses in a reed basket;
- the shepherd boy, David who stood

up to a bully;

- the young Mary who accepted the angel's proclamation;
- the Pharisee, Saul who prided himself as a persecutor of the early church;
- The priest, Luther who spoke out against the errors of the church;
- and Jesus himself.

So, the next time we are faced with such a situation, we need to be mindful and not jump to a WRONG IMPRESSION.
