Silence is kept for reflection.


P: Merciful and loving God,


Prayer of The Day

First reading: Genesis 32:22-31

The same night [Jacob] got up and took his two wives, his two maids, and his eleven children and crossed the ford of the Jabbok. He took them and sent them across the stream, and likewise everything that he had. Jacob was left alone, and a man wrestled with him until daybreak. When the man saw that he did not prevail against Jacob, he struck him on the hip socket, and Jacob's hip was put out of joint as he wrestled with him. Then he said, "Let me go, for the day is breaking." But Jacob said, "I will not let you go, unless you bless me." So he said to him, "What is your name?" And he said, "Jacob." Then the man said, "You shall no longer be called Jacob, but Israel, for you have striven with God and with humans and have prevailed." Then Jacob asked him, "Please tell me your name." But he said, "Why is it that you ask my name?" And there he blessed him. So Jacob called the place Peniel, saying, "For I have seen God face to face, yet my life is preserved." ¹⁴ But as for you, continue in what you have learned and firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it ¹⁵ and how from childhood you have known sacred writings that are able to instruct you for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. ¹⁶ All scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, ¹⁷ so that the person of God may be proficient, equipped for every good work.

^{4:1} In the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who is to judge the living and the dead, and in view of his appearing and his kingdom, I solemnly urge you: ² proclaim the message; be persistent whether the time is favorable or unfavorable; convince, rebuke, and encourage with the utmost patience in teaching. ³ For the time is coming when people will not put up with sound teaching, but, having their ears tickled, they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own desires ⁴ and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander away to myths. ⁵ As for you, be sober in everything, endure suffering, do the work of an evangelist, carry out your ministry fully. Charles' Music Notes: The choral anthem, Child of God, is a gospel ballad with resonant lyrics combined with a soulful melody for mixed choirs featuring the Rise & Shine chorus. The prelude, 'The Word Descending From Above", is a mystical treatment of the 13th century Latin communion hymn about the institution of the last supper. Listen for the way in which the composer features the Gregorian chant melody, but then shapes it to conjure a prayerful meditation before the church service begins. The communion voluntary, Berceuse, is a meditative lullaby that takes a simple tune and conjures the rocking of a cradle. The postlude, Carillon de Longpont, is a harmonic riff on the 4 note ringing sequence of the carillon at the chapel of the castle of Longpont in Aisne, France. There is a jazz-like quality to the ways in which the composer creates something whimsical, rhythmic and joyful from such a simple inspiration. Composed in 1913, one can't help wonder if the jazz innovations of the age influenced this work.
