

Apostles' Creed


I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Music Notes: Somos Uno (meaning, 'We are one') by Contemporary Composer Mark Hayes is a lively calypso-flavored tune that is a celebration of our unity in Christ. The syncopated opening theme is contrasted with a lyrical section followed by a chance for each voice part to shine. The addition of the steel drum enlivens the music and accentuates the Latin rhythms. The six Sonatas by J. S. Bach were written to help his son learn to play the organ and to develop skill in counterpoint. They are a classic example of 'learn to rub your tummy and pat your head'. You'll be impressed by how lyrical this school work is. The postlude is by Andre Campra, a French composer and conductor who was one of the leading opera composers of his time.
