
P Everlasting God,







Christmas Pointtsetia and Music dedications

Music Notes: The choral anthem is by a contemporary composer and is a widely performed setting of the text from Isaiah 4:4,5. The prelude is a setting of the Advent tune with which we started last week's, and this week's, services. The hymn has its origins in monastic life in Europe in the 8th and 9th centuries. The postlude is the closing movement of the sonata for which Charles played the first movement a few weeks ago. The 3 voices (each hand and the feet in the pedal) are independent, yet mesh into a beautiful whole. The two sections are in some ways 'mirror' images of each other—just one example of Bach's mastery of the mathematics of composition.
