





Music Notes: The choral anthems by contemporary composers mirror the mood of the joyous entry of Jesus into Jerusalem. The prelude is a paraphrase of the chorus from George Friederich Handel's oratorio Judas Maccabaeus celebrating another Biblical figure's procession. You will likely recognize the tune. In contrast, the postlude is taken from J.S Bach's *Orgelbuechlein* collection of chorale preludes. Alexander Guilmant played this slowly with a sad atmosphere, even though the text looks to the resurrection. This mirrors the feeling conveyed by the end of today's service.
