Music Notes: The anthem is two pieces from the oratorio, *Messiah*, by George Friederich Handel published in 1741. *The Trumpet Shall Sound* and *The Hallelujah Chorus* are from Part II, dealing with the death and resurrection of Jesus. Surely, this has to be among the most performed, including in 'sing-along' formats, of any classical music piece, ever. The prelude and postlude are also from the 'greatest hits' genre. You will recognize the tune on which the Carillon is based. It is very traditional that bells call people to worship. The toccata is also likely familiar to you — its been played at the end of Easter services for generations.
