
Eucharistic Prayer & Words of Institution



Music Notes: The choir anthem is a church music 'classic' by Samuel Sebastian Wesley, grandson of Charles Wesley who was famous for much of the hymnody of the Methodist movement. S. S. Wesley was famous in his own time as an organist and choirmaster. The anthem the choir sings today, Lead me, Lord is an extract from a larger work, Praise the Lord, O My Soul.

The title of the prelude means 'lullaby' in French. The berceuse form was popular particularly in the 19th century; it generally connoted a soothing melody with a 'rocking' quality to the composition — a fitting pairing with the child-like image of being led in the choir anthem. The postlude is another of the Eight 'Little' Preludes and Fugues attributed to Johann Sebastian Bach. Bach's music was so dear to S. S. Wesley's father that he gave the name Sebastian to Samuel as his middle name.

Part of being a community church is realizing that folks around us tend to see us a center of help and hope, even if they are not officially a part of us.

One of the ways that plays out, is that when folks are in need of basic necessities (food, gas, diapers, housing, etc) without any resources, they often approach one of our pastors for assistance. While we can't provide long term services, we can often help them bridge the need while helping them connect with other support.

In order to do be able to help folks who come to us, we have a "pastors' discretionary fund". This allows our pastors to provide, confidentially, a meal or two, a tank of gas, a motel for the night...well, you get the idea. We are working on developing practice and policy on how to do this in the safest and most effective way.

And that's where you come in. This fund is supported by your gifts, that come directly to the church earmarked for the pastors' discretionary fund, (NOT the individual pastors). It will be available for our pastors to use to provide the short term support described. And the more gifts we receive, the more help we can provide.

If you'd like to help, simply send your gift to the church office, clearly marked, Pastors' Discretionary Fund, and that gift will go directly to the fund.
