


## Sixth Sunday of Easter ~ May 5, 2024


#### The Words of Institution

Music Notes: The choir anthem is a classic, it even has its own Wikipedia page. It is a setting of a passage from the Gospel of John. First published in 1565 during the reign of Elizabeth I, it is an example of Tudor music when church music first began being sung in English rather than Latin. It has been sung at special occasions including a papal visit and a royal wedding.

The prelude also comes from the English church. George Oldroyd was an organist as well as composer. The postlude continues the run of trumpet tunes. You may remember this one from the introduction to Alistair Cooke's 'Masterpiece Theater' on television.
