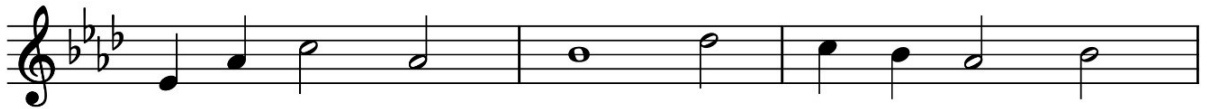

Music notes: The choir anthem is drawn from *Messiah*, the world famous work for orchestra and chorus by G.F. Handel, setting various texts from the Bible that illustrate the life and work of Jesus. The text for ‘*Surely, he has born our griefs*’ is taken from Isaiah and is one of the lessons appointed for today. To keep with the style, the prelude, communion and postlude are taken from a suite drawn from Handel’s music for the royal fireworks, originally composed to celebrate the treaty ending a war between England and France in 1746. That work for orchestra was freely arranged for the organ by E. Power Biggs.
