


Eucharistic Prayer




WELCA received \$1,421.00 for the 2024 Thankoffering; this was sent to the women's churchwide organization for various ministries. Thank you for your constant generosity.

Please check out the WELCA bulletin board in the narthex once a month. We will now include info about church events, LWR, etc., along with the women's updates.


