## **Prayer of The Day**





#### In Loving Memory of Sandy McCauley

Charles' Music Notes: The choir anthem, *In Praise of the Trinity*, by Mary Kay Beall and John Carter was composed in honor of the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church, in Latrobe, Pennsylvania. The driving music reflects the decisive text and resembles the shape-note genre with its hearty melody and earthy feel. The flute obbligato supports the melody while providing its own evocative lines. The prelude is the composer's own arrangement for organ solo of the slow movement of his Sonata for trumpet and piano. You may remember the tune of the opening hymn, *Come Join the Dance of Trinity*, was played by the Campanile ringers on Pentecost Sunday. The German original of the text for the hymn of the day, *Holy God, We Praise Your Name*, is a metrical version of the *Te Deum Laudamus*, one of the principal hymns of the Christian church. It may have been written as early as the year 414. Finally, the postlude is a setting of the popular *Sheep May Safely Graze* by J.S. Bach. It is arranged for piano and organ with alto soloist. It represents that 'changing of the guard' as Charles von Gunten takes a summer rest and Geoff Graham steps into the organist role until mid-September. Both of them adore the musicianship and leadership of Katy Lundeen, a noted alto soloist in addition to being our music director.
