- Nap Time Pillow, 2 Blankets or Quilt, Footies for your feet

Prayer and Fasting Guide:

Practicing Self-Denial or Abstinence, Seeking Connection with God

The Types of Fasting There are FOUR primary forms of fasting (3 presented in the Bible):

- **The Normal Fast**: Abstaining from all food, solid or liquid, but not from water. Matthew 4:2
- **Partial Fast**: A Restriction of diet rather than complete abstention. Daniel 10:3
- Absolute Fast: Abstaining from both food and water. Esther 4:16 & Acts 9.9 Normally, this kind of fast should not last more than three days, for the body then begins to dehydrate. Moses and Elijah undertook the Absolute Fast for 40 days, but only under supernatural conditions. Exodus 34:24, Deut. 9:9; 1Kings 19:8
- **Liquid Fast**: Abstaining from solid food, consuming only water, fruit and/or vegetable juices. The bible has no mention of this type of fast, but it still has value for those with health restrictions.

Prayer and Fasting Guide (cont'd):

Practicing Self-Denial or Abstinence, Seeking Connection with God

Fasting with Prayer has Several Purposes:

- To honor God. (Matt. 16:18, Zec. 7:5, Lk. 2:37; Acts 3:2)
- To humble ourselves before God (Ezra 8:21; Ps.60:10; Isa. 58:3) to experience more grace (1 Peter.5:5) and God's intimate presence. (Isa. 57:15 & 58:6-9)
- To seek grace for a new task and to reaffirm our consecration to God. (Matthew 4:2)
- To seek God by drawing near to him and persisting in prayer against opposing spiritual forces. (Judges 20:26; Jer.29:12-14; Joel 2:12; Luke18:3 & Acts 9:10-19)
- To show repentance and to make way for God to change his declared intention of judgment. (2 Samuel 12:16,22)

The Benefits of Fasting While Praying

- To gain revelation and wisdom concerning God's will. (Isaiah: 58:5-6; Daniel 9:3,21-22, Acts 13:2-31)
- To open the way for the outpouring of the Holy Spirit and Christ's return to earth for his people. (Matt. 9:15)
- Christ himself practiced this discipline and taught that it should be a part of Christian devotion and an act of preparation for his return. Matthew 9:15. The NT Church practiced Acts.13:2-3, Acts 14:23:27:13

Understanding the Eight Prayer Watches

The First Prayer Watch (6 P.M. to 9 P.M.)

The first prayer watch begins in the evening, which is the "foundation" of night. It is also a time when we reflect upon what occurred during the day (good or bad) and pray a prayer of thanksgiving to God for being with us and bringing us through it (1 Chronicles 23:30).

The Second Prayer Watch (9 P.M. to 12 A.M.)

The second prayer watch is the time in which intercessors are able to impact the spiritual realm before the enemy gets ready to wreak havoc. In the natural, this watch is characterized by deep darkness. During this watch, intercessors need to pray for God's protection over their families, cities, and nations: "Let God arise, and His enemies be scattered" (Psalm 68:1).

The Third Prayer Watch (12 A.M. to 3 A.M.)

The third prayer watch is a period of spiritual activity. This watch hour will strengthen your faith. It is the same time that Peter denied Christ three times. Matthew 26:34; Luke 22:34, and John 13:38. The devil operates at this time because this is the time that men are in a deep sleep and there are not as many people praying to oppose him (1 King 3:20). This watch calls

for seasoned intercessors.



Understanding the Eight Prayer Watches

The Fourth Prayer Watch (3 A.M. to 6 A.M.)

The fourth prayer watch is always important because it is the last prayer watch of the night. It was during this time the Israelites were delivered from slavery in Egypt (Exodus 12, 14). Moreover, Jesus walked on the water to help His disciples who were caught in a storm during the fourth prayer watch (Mathew 14:25-33). Equally important, the fourth prayer watch is the time that satanic agents, who went out to perform their activities, are returning to their bases. Therefore, this watch is the time to establish the course of your day by speaking God's Word and breaking everything that would attempt to hinder His will for your life to manifest on the third day (Psalm 19:1).

The Fifth Prayer Watch (6 A.M. to 9 A.M.)

The fifth prayer watch is a time for building our spiritual and physical strength before the day begins (Acts 2 15; Psalm 2:7-9). The spiritual significance of sunrise is having Jesus Christ, the King of kings and the Lord of lords, rise over us (Malachi 4:2). During this watch, we should pray for such issues as healing in our bodies, relationships, family, government, and the economy.

The Sixth Prayer Watch (9 A.M. to 12 P.M.)

The sun is at its brightest during the sixth prayer watch. However, while Jesus Christ was dying on the cross, darkness fell across the land until about three in the afternoon (Mark 15:25 and Mathew 27:45). This was the darkest period known in human history.

The Sixth Prayer Watch (9 A.M. to 12 P.M.) cont'd

However, in spite of this, God's divine love for mankind shone brightly. The blood sacrifice of Jesus Christ redeemed mankind and restored his relationship with God, the Father. In light of this, the sixth prayer watch is a time to reflect on the power of the Cross. Because of Christ's work on the cross, we have direct access to God and His benefits and blessings.

The Seventh Prayer Watch (12 P.M. to 3 P.M.)

During this prayer watch, it is very important to pray in line with Acts 10:9 and Psalm 91. This is the time to pray to dwell in the secret place of the Most High, abide under the shadow of the Almighty, and make the Most High your habitation. Pray and cut off all satanic arrows that are released at this time so that they will not get you or your family.

The Eighth Prayer Watch (3 P.M. to 6 P.M.)

The eighth prayer watch is the hour of rejoicing in the power of the Cross. During this prayer watch, Christ willingly became a sin offering. Moreover, He shed His blood for the sins of the world so that all mankind would be reconciled with God, the Father (Colossians 1:20). Moreover, those who accept Jesus Christ's sacrifice can now live a triumphant life through Him and are allowed to come boldly before the throne of God, the Father (Hebrews 4:16). To come 'boldly" means that we can freely speak to God about all that is on our hearts and receive His mercy for our situation.



This portable temple was built in the wilderness by the Israelites circa 1450 B.C. after they were freed from Egyptian slavery. The Tabernacle was the first temple dedicated to God and the first resting place of the Ark of the Covenant. It served as a place of worship and sacrifices during the Israelites' 40 years in the desert while conquering the land of Canaan.

The final place in the Tabernacle was the Holy of Holies, where Ark of the Covenant is found. The Ark of the Covenant represents the presence of God. There, the High Priest interceded by praying on behalf of the people of God. Through Christ Jesus, we can enter into the presence of God and intercede on behalf of those around us.
